Topic: Living and non-living

1. Painting and drawing

Ask students to:






How to draw farm animals




Baby animal match

Mammals	Cows, horses, pigs, sheep, cats and dogs are all mammals
An elephant and a mouse are also mammals.	A mammal is an animal that feeds its babies on milk
Most mammals have hair, wool or fur.	A mammal's blood is always warm. Tigers, lions, whales, and all other mammals have warm blood.
Most mammals have babies that are born. Their babies do not hatch from eggs.	There are only two animals that have babies that hatch from eggs. These animals live in Australia. They are the platypus and the echidna.
