Rules for writing

- 1. Think about your topic and make a plan.
- 2. Decide whether your story will be about something that has already happened, is happening now, or is going to happen.
- 3. Begin every sentence with a capital letter and use capital letters for names.
- 4. End every sentence with a full stop. Use question marks for questions.
- 5. Think of a good beginning, middle and end.
- 6. Try not to use "and then" in your stories.
- 7. Don't make your sentences too long.
- 8. When using speech marks, try to think of interesting words to replace '*said*', e.g., "This is delicious!" *exclaimed* Mia.
- 9. Ask for help with words you cannot spell, or use a try-out pad or a dictionary.
- Remember to use some interesting words to describe things – adjectives to describe nouns; adverbs to describe verbs.
- 11. Break up your story by using paragraphs.
- 12. Use your imagination but keep away from things that would not honour God, e.g. horror, spooks, ghosts, witches, UFOs.
