
This diagram shows what some people believe about the creation of the world. Start looking at it from the bottom of the diagram and work upwards.

Week 3: Evidence that God is true

The Creation tells us that God is true.

God has made mathematics, and the created world is based on mathematics. We are part of His creation, and made in His image. So we can know and understand about the patterns and laws of God's world. Mathematics can help us in discovering the truth.

Jeremiah 33:25 says, "But I the Lord have a covenant with day and night, and I have made the laws that control the earth and the sky."




God's original creation was perfect and beautiful: trees, flowers, animals, rivers, deserts, stars... Even though some of the Creation became corrupted because of the Fall, we still see amazing beauty in creation all around us today. Mathematics helps us to understand some of this beauty.

There is a series of numbers named after one person who first recorded it, the Fibonacci Sequence. It is like this:

1, 1, 2, 3, 5, 8, 13, 21, 34, 55

The sequence is made by adding up the 2 numbers that come before, to get the next number in the sequence.

God has used this in the arrangement of petals of flowers, in the stem arrangement of branches and leaves, in the organisation of seeds in sunflowers, in the whorls on pineapples and pine cones, and in the creation of seashells.



God says that people can look around them and see that there is a one true God, creator of all. In Romans 1:20, God says that people have no _____ for not believing in Him.
