How do you draw attention to the nature of God? Our pride seeks its own glory and continually wants to flaunt our own goodness, when what we truly need is God and His abundant goodness and love. 8 Out of Darkness in to Light

"But you are a chosen generation...called...**out of darkness into His marvellous light**..." –1 Pet 2:9

Darkness and light are very common symbols throughout Scripture. "Light" refers to the truth of the God's Word compared to the "darkness" of lies and deception. "Light" also refers to purity and holiness contrasted with the "darkness" of sin. Prior to receiving Jesus we are bound by sin and the ultimate end of sin: death. The Apostle Paul teaches us in Romans 6, "You have been set free from sin. God has made you his slaves. The benefit you gain leads to holy living. And the end result is eternal life. When you sin, the pay you get is death. But God gives you the gift of eternal life because of what Christ Jesus our Lord has done." (v22-23 NIRV). Have you received Jesus? How do you know? Also how do you respond to this statement from the Apostle John? "If anyone claims, 'I am living in the light,' but hates a Christian brother or sister, that person is still living in darkness" (1 John 2:9 NLT).

	were applied, so our good deeds melt the hearts of those who oppose us.

Our Heavenly Father knows how to give good gifts to His children; Jesus promises this in Matthew 7: "You parents—if your children ask for a loaf of bread, do you give them a stone instead? Or if they ask for a fish, do you give them a snake? Of course not! So if you sinful people know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Heavenly Father give good gifts to those who ask him" (v9-11, NLT). While you do not have a perfect father (no one does!) your Heavenly Father IS perfect: He created you, He understands you, He loves you, and He wants to be in intimate relationship with you.

What do you need from the Father as you finish this year? Take some time to ask Him today and throughout this week.
