7. Limericks

In a castle that had a deep moat Lived a chicken a duck and a goat. They wanted to go out And wander about But they didn't have a boat.

8. Cinquains

These poems have five lines:

Line 1: 1 noun

Line 2: 2 related adjectives

Line 3: 3 descriptive gerunds (verb + -ing)

Line 4: 1 complete, related sentence

Line 5: 1 noun (a synonym of first noun)

Example: War

War

Sad, destructive Killing, injuring, destroying A thing that kills life.

Terminator

9. Haiku

This is a traditional form of Japanese poetry. The first two lines make a statement and in the final line these two statements are combined.

Line 1: 5 syllables

Line 2: 7 syllables

Line 3: 5 syllables

Example:

Falling to the ground
I watch a leaf settle down
In a bed of brown
