Useful Resources

Play dough recipe

2 ½ cups water

1 ¼ cup salt

1 ½ tablespoon cream of tartar (OR 1 tablespoon baking powder if you can't get it)

5 tablespoons of vegetable oil

2 ½ cup flour

Food coloring

Steps

Place all the ingredients but the food coloring together in a large pot and stir until somewhat smooth.

Place the pot on the stove and cook over a low heat. Stir frequently with a large spoon.

Place the dough on a table top. Knead the warm dough until it's smooth.

- Matching the sounds of the alphabet letters with lower case letters
- Writing the letters of the alphabet
- Copying writing patterns; holding pencil correctly
- Maths extension counting backwards, ordinal number, addition, subtraction, making groups of objects; number lines
- Verbally forming a sentence for the teacher to write down. It could be about a picture they have drawn.
- Contributing drawings to a class BIG BOOK
- Making groups of objects, e.g. 3 groups of 2
- Simple addition and subtraction with numbers to 10

Bible Lessons (continued)

Friday: The dinosaurs – Which day did God make them? Why are they not here today? They are 'extinct' (explain). People say they lived millions of years ago but that is not true because the Bible tells us they were created about 6000 years ago, when He made the world.

Literacy & Numeracy (continued) 5-yr-olds

Practice writing their name, copying from a name card.

Sounds – use a picture or object collection and ask them to say the BEGINNING sound of the picture or object you pull out. (mat time) Do not show them any letters yet.

Flashcards – have pairs of words on a table. They have to put the same words together. They do not have to know what the words say.

Make a Big Book – Jesus loves me.

– Jesus loves (child's name)
Each child draws a picture of themselves leaving space for you to write in large clear letters underneath. Staple it together and make a Big Book.

Counting: Counting animals, fish etc to 10 (mat time)
Set out different numbers of animals, e.g. 7 – How many are here? Count.

Hand and finger prints for "God made me special" (Creation Day 6)

Plant collage Use paper plates and stick on flowers, grasses and leaves. Label "Day 3"

Underwater scene – children draw fish and sea creatures with crayon. Paint over the drawing with a thin blue paint wash. (Creation Day 5)

Cut-out fish (Creation Day 5) Hang them from the ceiling.

Animal stick puppets – paper animals stuck to sticks. Use for a puppet show

People are God's special creation; We are made in God's image, with the ability to think, feel and choose. Memory Verse: How great is the love of God our Father, that we are called children of God. 1 John.3:1a Monday: People are special to God – more special than animals. God loves everyone. (Ask children to turn to a partner and think of something special about that person.) God made everyone special and loves everyone very much. We are the same in some ways. We have eyes and feet, but different in other ways. (Ask children to think of ways in which people are different.) Everyone is special to God. He told us that He even knows how many hairs on our heads! (Mt.10:29-31) Tuesday: Memory verse – John 3:1a. Who are God's children? We are. How much does God the Father love us? Does He love some people more than others?	 Topic: The human body introduce and name body parts pointing out their specific purposes or abilities. Try out different movements, e.g. Ask, 'What can our hands do?' wave, grasp, point, stroke, rub, scratch, tickle, clap, etc. What are our 5 senses? (sight, smell, hearing, touch, taste) People are created differently to animals. Discuss some of the things we can do that animals cannot do: drawing, building, discussing, writing, thinking about right and wrong choices. Ask: 'Can a dog go shopping for his food? Could a cat learn to read? Drawing activity: Children can help each other trace around themselves on a huge sheet of paper. They can then add details inside their body shape, such as facial features, hair, and can add clothes if they wish. Some may be familiar with internal organs such as heart and lungs. 	Finger plays Which is different activity: Teacher draws 5 cats, but one doesn't have a tail. Then 6 ladybugs, each with 6 spots, but one only has 4 spots. Sounds – listen for beginning sounds of body parts, they say – "h hair; n nose" etc. Do not use letter names. Counting rhymes Counting fingers	Doctors and nurses station: role play Mirrors: children can look at themselves in the mirror. Have drawing materials on the same table. Children can draw their own face. Shop: Set out empty food packets or pictures of food, clothes etc. Provide shopping baskets. Children have to choose which things they will buy. Dolls and teddies: Children have to choose which clothes to dress them in.

Bible Lessons (continued)
Wednesday: We can make
choices. We can make choices
about a lot of things: what we
have for a snack, which colour of
pencil to draw with, which toy to
play with. Can a doll or a teddy
make choices? No, they cannot
make choices like we can. (Show
pictures of foods, or objects on a
tray. Ask children to come up and
make a choice.)

Thursday: Yesterday we made choices about things we like. We also have to make a choice sometimes between what's right or wrong, e.g. We choose whether to wait our turn or to push in front of another child, whether to put away our toys when we are asked. Friday: People are valuable. What does that mean? We have to treat one another carefully and kindly. God tells us to 'love one another'. (Have some paper hearts cut out. Ask to children pair up. Each one gives their heart to the partner.)

Science/Social Studies/Art
Collage activity: Use match sticks,

representing bones, to glue on to paper inside an outline of the human body.

Printing: try foot prints this week, or draw around the feet and colour inside with patterns.

Literacy & Numeracy 5-yr-olds

Sounds: Continue to revise the sounds of the letters of the alphabet using pictures. Do not use letter names yet and do not show them any letters yet.

Play "I spy"

Make a big book: We are all different

Each child draws a picture of a friend. They have to draw something special about what that friend can do. Teacher writes sentence underneath, e.g. 'Sara can make a cake.' Staple pages together to make a book.

Make a big book: Choices

Each child draws a picture of themselves choosing something, e.g. I can choose (teacher writes sentence at the bottom)

Read Big Book from last week.

Creative free choice activities

Restaurant and Playdough – children make 'foods' for customers to choose.

(Teachers can reinforce the word 'choose' as they are interacting with children in free play.)

Bible Lessons (continued)

Thursday: God thinks of me:

Ps.139:15-18 tells us that God thought about us and planned for us. God is everywhere; is always thinking about us and has good plans for those who follow His ways.

What is a plan? What is a good plan? What good plan could God have for you? God has good plans for us when we love Him. How can we show that we love Him?

Friday: God listens to us. Because He loves us so much, He wants to hear us pray. (Ask the children what we can pray for. Ask the children to find a partner and let each child pray for the other person.)

Literacy & Numeracy (continued) 5 yr-olds

Make a 'ME' book.

Teacher can write the sentences for each page:

This is me. (Drawing of themselves) My name is ...

My birthday is on ... (They can draw a birthday cake)

I am ... years old.

I am ...cm tall.

I like to eat ...

This is my hand.

This is my foot.

Read Big Books made previously.

Sounds: begin matching sounds and letters – 'a' ant (See Bible Phonics). Learn the rhyme.

Maths





Within the week's theme of God's goodness, emphasize God's goodness in meeting the desperate need, God's goodness knowing and caring about the problem and sadness of this poor family, and God's goodness in providing abundance God's goodness in hearing our prayers for help.

Health aspects of oil: This is a good opportunity for *teachers* to learn about the health aspects of oil. Oil and fat are essential to help us absorb nutrients, to protect our cells and for energy. There are good fats and bad fats. The Bible tells us about good fats: olive oil is a most stable oil and good for our health. "Stable" means that it does not change very much with heat, whereas cheap oils like canola oils change easily to for a potentially cancer producing oil that can damage our cells. Margarine is also in this category, (a bad fat). People of Bible times would have used butter, which is a natural product, very stable, and gives Vitamins A,D,E and K. Coconut oil is a good fat because it helps us burn other fats.

At 10, hop with both feet, turn around, and head back toward the start. When you reach the square where your stone is again, pick it up—still on one foot! —and complete the course.


If you finished without any mistakes, pass the stone to the next player. On your next turn, throw the stone into the second square; (third turn – third square etc.)



Recipe for Hot Cross Buns

Ingredients:
1 ½ cups self-raising flour

1 teaspoon of baking powder

2 teaspoons of spice

(Mix all together in a bowl.)

¼ cup of sugar

1 dessertspoon of butter

⅓ cup of mashed potato

⅓ cup of milk

1 egg

Method:

Add potato, butter, milk and egg to the dry ingredients. MIX. Place in teaspoonfuls on a greased tray. Add crosses. Bake in a moderate oven (180°C) for 25 min. *Crosses:* a little cocoa, self-raising flour. Use a little milk to make a dough.

Wednesday: Memory verse 1 John 1:5. The Bible tells us that light is like God's goodness. God's light can shine inside us and help us to make right choices. Can you think of some good choices we can make? Evil does not like light. When the light of Jesus came to Saul, the darkness in his life was gone, because he chose to follow Jesus.

Thursday: Story - Paul and Silas in jail, Acts 16:16-40 This story shows how Paul went on to be a servant of God.

Friday: The earth is special

The earth is the only planet where people can live. God made it that way. Why is the earth special? Jesus came to earth! The earth is turning, giving us times of light and dark. When our part of the earth is facing towards the sun it is day. When is it away from the sun it is dark. (Use a torch to represent the sun and a ball for the earth.)

Science (continued)

God created light on the first day and then on Day 4, He created other things to give us light

The Sun: He created the Sun, which makes so much light and heat. It is made of burning gases. The sun is so bright, we should never look right at it as it hurts our eyes!

Other stars: (like the sun but further away.)

The Planets: Remember that there are now 8 planets and not 9. Pluto has been classified as a dwarf planet and not a planet.

The Moon: which has no light itself but reflects the sun's light. The moon and stars give us some light at night.

After Adam and Eve disobeyed, then all their children and grandchildren disobeyed too. The world became a bad place, full of fighting and killing. But there was one man, Noah, who listened to Father God and obeyed Him. God chose Noah and his family to build the ark and bring in the animals so that they could be saved from the flood. Because Noah obeyed, he and his family were kept safe.

Friday: Revise Noah. Ask children to retell the events. Why did people in the world do bad things? Why did God have to send the flood? Who obeyed? How did God save the animals? After the flood God sent a rainbow of promise — that He would never again send a flood to cover the whole earth. Discuss how God keeps all His promises.



Thursday: Talk about forgiveness. How did Joseph feel when his brother came to visit? Do you think it was hard for him to forgive his brothers? Joseph chose to forgive his brothers even when they had been so cruel to him. He knew that God understood and trusted him instead of trying to get even and hurt his brothers. Sometimes we want to get even with someone who has done wrong to us. Maybe we say, "I will not talk to that person anymore!" But what would God want us to do?



Think of some of the very special things that animals can do....frogs hop, kangaroos jump, cows give milk, sheep give wool, dogs do tricks, kittens chase string. Look at pictures of animals. God loves the animals that He made. Read Matthew 10:29. He wants us to love and care for them too. Who has an animal at home? How should we look after our animals? e.g. Do not let dogs and cats wander around at night. They could get into a fight or hit by a car. Keep dogs safely in your yard, and cats in the house. Wash your dog to keep fleas away and remember to give them food and water. Love them, talk to them and pat them. Pray that our animals will be safe and happy as we help to look after them. **Thursday:** Matthew 6:26-34 If God cares for the birds and flowers, how much more will He care for us.





At the end of the week, or next week, the teacher can write information on what they have found out—the answers to their questions. This information goes with their pictures.







Snail-like animals that do not have a

Most snail species have tongue that contains thousands of tiny teeth, for eating food. What do they eat?

Land snails eat leaves, stems and flowers.

There are also sea snails which eat both sea weed and shell fish.

A snail moves very slowly. It is one of the slowest creatures on Earth.

As they move along snails leave behind a silver trail of slippery slimy stuff that helps them move along.



Wednesday: Matthew 6: 25-34 God looks after the birds and flowers, so how much more will He care for us? What colours can animals be? What can animals do? They can move about... run walk hop, fly.

Can plants do this? How do plants stay in the ground? What colours are plants? What do plants have? (green leaves etc.)

Thursday: God made people to be even more special than animals. What can people do that animals can't do? People can love and serve God. Talk about the things people can do to serve God.

Friday: Will there be animals in Heaven? Isaiah 11:6 says, The wolf shall live with the lamb, and the leopard shall lie down with the young goat, and the calf and the lion and the fattened calf together; and a little child shall lead them.

Give the children magnifying glasses and let them explore the outside environment. Give them each a page divided down the middle with "Living" on one side, (draw a picture of a living thing — they probably won't be able to read the word yet) ... and non-living on the other. Ask them to be 'scientists' to investigate and discover which of a number of items are living and non-living. Have pictures of living and non-living things for the children to colour (or sort before colouring).

Bible Lessons

When Jesus was a boy, He grew just like us. The bible says that Jesus also grew in wisdom, (knowing the right things to do, and doing the right thing.) God wants us to grow in wisdom too by making right choices, including right choices about healthy living. Lk.2:40;52

Memory Verse: Jesus grew to become strong and wise. Luke 2:40

Monday: Jesus as a boy

The Bible tells us that Jesus grew in his body as we do, and at the same time, He learned how to read and do maths. He learned how to get along with others, and in He learned about His Heavenly Father God. Jesus was born as a baby, to his mother Mary and father Joseph. (Yes – Jesus had a heavenly father and father on earth. We celebrate His birth at Christmas), but Jesus didn't stay a baby. He grew to be a little boy and learned to walk and talk just as all babies do. What other things do babies and toddlers have to learn?

Talk about things babies cannot do, and what parents do to look after the baby.

Science/Social Studies/Art

Topic: Growing up to be healthy What does 'healthy' mean? Healthy Food:

God has provided us with so many different foods, from plants and animal. Which foods make us strong and help us to keep well? Which foods could make us feel tired, and even get sick if we ate foo much of it?

Exercise: Our bodies need to move and have exercise which strengthens our muscles. Let's do some exercise now... running on the spot, doing some start jumps. What exercise can we do when we play outside?

Water: What is the best drink? Water, juice or fizzy drink? If you are wise, which will you choose?

The Lunch Box Game Preparation:

Have picture collection of healthy foods and junk foods. (Laminate them so this becomes a resource to be used each year.) Put the pictures in a bag or box. Also have ready a lunch box and a bucket.


Matching game – 2 – 4 players

4-yr-olds

Teach the children to play "Go fish". Make 7 sets of fruit-vegetable cards, 4 in each set. (e.g. 4 carrot cards, 4 apple cards etc. – 28 cards altogether). To play, shuffle the cards and give each player 5 cards. (They hold them in a fan facing themselves and do not show the others.) They pull out any pairs. The aim is to get as many pairs as possible. Now, the first player starts and can ask anyone for a card to match the one they need, e.g. Jess, do you have a banana? If Jess has a banana, she has to hand it over. (And the player says 'thank you!') If the answer is 'no', Jess says, "Go fish" and the player can pick up a card from the stack of spares on the table. Then next person has a turn to ask a question to another, and so on. If a player runs out of cards, they can pick up enough cards to make 5 from the stack on the table.

They shouldn't be able to see what they are choosing – they can close their eyes to pick.

Once they have their picture, they have to decide to put it in the lunch box (health food) or the bucket (junk food).

If you have the book, "The very Hungry Caterpillar" this is an excellent book. If you don't, make one: (one page per day)


A caterpillar hatched out of a small egg on a leaf.

Make a poster to show all 6 healthy habits: 3 from last week, (healthy food, water and exercise), plus the following:

Washing and keeping clean: Have some soap (good for a smelling experience), toothpaste and brush, shampoo. What do we use these for? It is important to look after our bodies by washing, caring for our teeth and brushing hair.

Sunshine and fresh air make us healthy too. It important to play outside.


Sleep: We all need to rest. When we are asleep our body grows and gets stronger. If we didn't sleep, we would be very tired! When should we go to bed? (when our parents tell us to; not too long after dark)

Continue with emphasizing exercise activities and outdoor play this week.

Taste and see graph. Cut up three kinds of fruits e.g. watermelon, pineapple, mango. The children take turns to try all 3. They decide which one they like best. Give the children a square of paper each. They are to colour the paper in the colour of the fruit they liked best. Have a large sheet of paper for making a graph. The children are to stick their square on the graph, (in a line). Count how many squares of each colour. See which fruit is the most popular. This is the same activity we used in Term 1 (Provider) but this time choose different fruits.

What do you have to do to 'listen carefully'? (Look at the speaker, pay attention, listening quietly while the other person speaks and wait for our turn to speak.) This is called 'attentive listening'.

Discuss rules for crossing the road. Is it safe to play near the road? Why not?

Free play with small cars and trucks. Make a road mat for them to go on. If you don't have any cars and trucks, draw and cut out pictures of cars and stick them on wooden blocks so they stand up.



Make cars from large cardboard boxes that children can sit in.

Literacy & Numeracy Listening games for all:

Doggy doggy, who's got the bone -The 'doggy' sits in the centre of the circle with eyes closed. The 'bone' is on the ground behind him. Someone is chosen to creep up and steal the bone. The 'doggy' must listen to where the footsteps came from. When the 'thief' is back in his place, the signal is given by the chant, "Doggie, doggie, who's got the bone?" and the 'doggie' must guess who stole the bone.


Razzle Tazzle – Similar to "Doggie Doggie" - Instead of a bone, use a bell, or some jingle bells. Say: Razzle, Tazzle can you tell who has come to steal your bell?

Environmental sounds. Ask the children to be as quiet as possible, to close their eyes for 30 seconds and see how many sounds they can hear.

Near and far sounds: Children have to identify high and low sounds when you make the sounds with voice or musical instrument.

Creative free choice activities Enlargement p.90

Ask a question, e.g. what did you have for breakfast today? Or 'what's your favourite thing to play with?' Pass around an object for them to hold in their hand while they talk. They pass on when they are finished. Only the person holding this object is allowed to speak, and they need to wait until it comes around to their turn.



Percussion sounds - Ask children to close their eyes and make three sounds on three different percussion instruments, e.g. a triangle, a drum, cymbals. Children have to say the order in which they heard the sounds.

The Good Shepherd

Jesus sometimes told stories about sheep and shepherds. In the land where Jesus lived a shepherd was a person who looked after the sheep. He always carried a crook with him as well as a sling shot, in case wild animals tried to run off with one of the sheep. A shepherd had to be very brave. If a wolf or a lion or a bear came along, he would protect the sheep. He would use the sling-shot to hurl a stone at the animal and his crook to fight it off.

A shepherd also helped a sheep out of trouble. Sometimes a sheep wandered into thick prickle bushes and couldn't get out. Then the shepherd would gently lift the sheep out of the bushes and put it back with the others. Sometimes sheep were troublesome. They wouldn't go where they were meant to. Then the shepherd used his crook to make them go the right way.

A shepherd loved his sheep very much. He even had a name for every sheep. What do you think some of their names might be? The sheep knew the shepherd too. They knew the sound of his voice and could pick it out amongst other voices. Can you recognise the voice of your Mum or Dad.....even when you can't see them? You know their voices very, very well, and that's how it was with the shepherd and his sheep.

Sometimes bad men came along to the sheep-fold and tried to steal the sheep. The bad men didn't go through the gate, but crept under the fence and hid behind a bush. Then they called to one of the sheep to come to them. But the sheep wouldn't come. It didn't know the stranger's voice. Instead, the sheep ran to the sheepherd knowing that the sheepherd would protect it.

Jesus told this story about the shepherd and the sheep because He wants us to love Him just as the sheep love their shepherd. Jesus is like our shepherd because He loves us. He protects us from danger and always cares for us. Jesus wants us to follow Him, just like the sheep follow the shepherd. They wouldn't follow anyone else because they only know the voice of the shepherd.

And God spoke to Samuel. From then on God talked to Samuel. Samuel told God's people what God said. Samuel was a prophet.



Wednesday Memory verse Col.3:20 Talk about some of the instructions that children are given by parents, e.g. to come when called, to share with your brother or sister, to eat your food, to help with a job. Two teachers can act out situations where children have to choose to obey. (Don't act out wrong responses, just talk about how they made the right choice, instead of the wrong choice which could have been)

God our Father is the One able to redeem and restore. "Though my father and mother forsake me, the Lord will receive me" Ps.27:10





Thursday: Paul tells people about God the Creator. Another servant of God who told people about Jesus was Paul. Paul went to Athens and saw that there were a lot of false gods (idols). He taught the people that there is only one true God. (Tells the story from Acts 17:16-34.) Friday: Bible translators. What language do we speak? The first Bible was in the language spoken by Jesus in His country. It was called "Hebrew". But later it was 'translated' into English. That means it was changed from one language to another, but the meaning didn't change. We can say "Hello" in English or in French, "Bonjour." Now the Bible has been translated into many, many different languages so that people all over the world can read the Bible.

Writing or typing

Write names of children in the class on a chart. Let children come out and point to their own name.

Show the children what a false god looks like - picture, or artifact, e.g. wooden mask – or block of wood. Thursday: The Golden Calf What is idol worship? God made us to worship Him, and no one else. When people worship and pray to other things, these are called idols. Remember when we learned about Moses? God gave him some rules for the people. One of these was "Have no other gods except Me." But when Moses came down from the mountain, after God talked with Him about the rules. Moses found that the people had made an idol and were worshiping it! **Friday:** There are many people who do not know Father God. Not everyone has heard about Father God in the way that we have. Some have never even heard His name! But Father God loves all people very much and wants them to know Him. God sends missionaries to go and tell them about Father God. It's not just people in other places who need to know about Father God and to love and worship Him.



Science/Social Studies/Art

Topic: How animals hide When God made the world, everything was beautiful. There was no rubbish, no insect pests, and animals did not kill one another. But when Adam and Eve disobeyed God in the Garden of Eden, Satan entered God's beautiful world and made some animals kill other animals. The lions, who used to eat just grass, now wanted to eat meat! That meant killing other animals. God was sad, so gave some animals special markings to help them hide from the lions. In Africa, where lions live, they kill zebras and giraffe for their food. But God gave the zebra stripes and the giraffe patterns that blend in with the shadows of the trees. Although lions still kill zebras and giraffes, they cannot kill so many because they do not always see them hiding. God also made zebras and giraffes fast runners so that they can run away from lions.



True story of Brother Andrew

As a boy, Brother Andrew, grew up in a country called Holland. When Andrew grew older, he wanted to help Christians in some of the countries near-by, that were not allowed to have Bibles. He would drive his van to those countries, carrying Bibles in secret places in the van.

One time, on the journey, he started to feel hungry so decided to stop for some lunch. He drove down to the river bank. Along came a boat. The boat stopped where Brother Andrew was eating lunch. There were two soldiers in the boat. "Lord," Andrew prayed, "help me not to be afraid."

The first soldier held the machine-gun at Andrew, while the other one ran to the van. Andrew kept eating his lunch. He heard the car door open. The soldiers were looking to see if he was carrying anything they didn't like – Bibles!

Andrew reached into his picnic box and drew out two extra plates. He asked one of the soldiers to down and share some food. The soldier shook his head. Andrew could hear the other soldier poking around. Any moment now he was going to ask about those boxes that the Bibles were in. Andrew prayed, and then an amazing thing happened. While he prayed there was no sound from the soldier inspecting his car. Just as soon as he had finished praying, the door slammed. Andrew heard the sound of footsteps coming towards him. For a moment both soldiers stood over him. Then quickly they ran to their boat, got in and sped away. That was the last he saw of them.

God is Truth Week 1: God wants us to know what the Bible says, so we do not follow those who make wrong choices.

Bible Lessons

Jesus used God's word when tempted. The Bible is true, and the stories happened at a real time, in a real place, with real people.

Memory Verse: I have hidden Your Word in my heart that I might not sin against You. Ps.119:11

Monday: Jesus is tempted by

Satan: Matt. 4:1-11

Jesus didn't tell Satan to go away using ordinary words. He used God's word, the Bible. Satan is the enemy of God. He tries to make us do wrong things, as he tried to make Jesus do wrong things. But Jesus did not do what Satan asked. When we feel like doing the wrong thing, it is called 'being tempted'. But we do not HAVE to do the wrong thing. We3 can say 'no' and choose to do the right thing instead.

Tuesday: Revision of story, and teach memory verse: Ps 119:11 Wednesday: Situations to discuss: Mum tells you it's time for bed, but you don't want to stop playing. What should you do?

Science/Social Studies/Art

Topic: Life in Bible times

Show the children a globe and point out where your country is, and where Israel is. Some of Israel is desert, as in our story. Another country, nearby, is Egypt, which is also desert. A desert is a place where there is not much rain. Only certain plants can grow – ones that are really tough. The ground is sandy and rocky and the sun makes it very hot.

Desert Plants: Father God created some plants that can live very well in the desert. Some have very long roots to go a long way underground and find water. Others store water inside them, like cacti. Some cacti have spikes to protect them from being eaten by animals.

Desert animals: God also made animals that can live in the desert. Reptiles: snakes and lizards have a scaly skin that protects them from the heat. They can hide under the sand or between rocks to keep cool during the day, and come out to catch food at night when it's cooler.

Literacy & Numeracy

4-yr-olds



A child in kindergarten is finding it hard to get his shoes on. Another boy starts to tease him. What do you do?

You are playing with a ball, then your friend comes along and asks to play too. You would really like to have it to yourself. What will you say? (You could say, 'not right now, but come back in a minute and then you can play'.

Thurs-Fri: Discuss verses: Be kind and gentle. Eph. 4:32 Love one

Camels: A camel's feet are wide (as large as a dinner plate!) and padded to protect it from the heat. A camel has 3 eyelids, long eyelashes and thick eyebrows to keep the sand out of their eyes. Their nose and ears can open and shut; they have strong teeth that can chew cacti. Camels can walk a long way and carry heavy loads. They can travel for days without food and even water food.

Cactus addition: 5-yr-olds

Use the same format as for 4-yr-olds but extend to addition, (different numbers of counters on each branch of the cactus), e.g. 2 and 3 and 3 make 8.

God is Truth Week 2: God knows all about us.

Bible Lessons

Jesus knows about all people. Jesus knew about the woman at the well. **Memory Verse:** He knows everyone, everywhere and nothing can be hidden from Him. Heb.4:13 Monday: **The woman at the well:** John 4:4-26

(Note: In telling this story to children, it is not appropriate to go into details of her lifestyle, but just highlight the fact that that Jesus *knew all about her.*) Jesus knew that this woman had made wrong choices, but He was kind to her. Because of this she listened to Him and brought others to meet Him. Jesus knew all about the woman, even though He'd never met her before. This woman was from a different country, called Samaria. The people of Samaria usually did not talk to people from the land where Jesus was from. But Jesus showed love and kindness to the Samaritan woman. Jesus knew all about her life and told her about some of her wrong choices, but He offered her a new start.

Science/Social Studies/Art

Topic: Getting water in Bible times We cannot live without water for

very long. God created the earth with a lot of water! Show a globe if possible.

What is water like? It's a liquid. We can pour it, but we can't really hold it, (show it running through your fingers.)

Ask: What colour is it? You can see through water and see things in it or behind it. What does it smell like? What does it taste like?

Water does not have much taste or smell of its own.

More about water: What happens when water gets hot or cold? How do you make an ice-block? An ice-block is hard because it's very, very cold.

When water gets very, very hot it turns into steam.

How we use water:

Drinks: Our bodies need water. God made us that way and provided water to drink. We can drink it just as it is, or we can make other drinks. But pure water is the healthiest drink.





The woman was so amazed by her time with Jesus, that she went to tell everyone else about Him. They came with her to meet Jesus and wanted Him to stay longer. He stayed 2 more days and many Samaritans came to believe that Jesus was the special one sent by Father God.

Tuesday: Revise story and teach memory verse.

Wednesday: Revise the story of **Nathanael**, John 1:43-50. God knew all about him too.

Thursday: Jesus knows everything about us: where we live, who is in our family, what we like to eat. He also knows how we feel, and what we like or don't like. He knows what makes us happy, sad, angry, worried or scared. Who sometimes feels worried or scared? Why might children sometimes feel this way? We can pray to Jesus when we are feeling sad, worried or scared.



Washing: How do we use water to keep ourselves clean? How about keeping our clothes clean?






Topic: People of Bible times



Practical Application The children will need some explanation of what a 'plan' actually is. What is a plan? 'A plan is something you think about that you want to do or make and then you follow it.'
