- The student uses the shape of the word to help identify the word.








#### 4 year-olds by the end of the year

- Cutting and pasting using scissors
- Persevering when they find something difficult
- Drawing a human figure
- Joining with other student to form a circle for a game
- Counting to 10 or 20, and recognizing numbers to 10
- Recognizing their name and it possible, write it
- Saying the initial sounds for objects and pictures
- Finding the odd one out; which one is missing; which is different
- Starting a writing pattern from the left and moving to the right
- Shape and colour recognition

#### 5 year-olds by the end of the year

- Everything from the 4 year-old year, PLUS
- Recognizing and saying the sounds of the alphabet letters
- Writing the letters of the alphabet
- Copying writing patterns; holding pencil correctly
- Maths extension counting backwards, ordinal number, addition, subtraction, making groups of objects; number lines
- Verbally forming a sentence for the teacher to write down. It could be about a
  picture they have drawn.
- Drawing pictures for class BIG BOOKS
- Numbers to 20 counting, adding and subtracting, making groups, completing patterns
