Then God said, "Let there be plants."

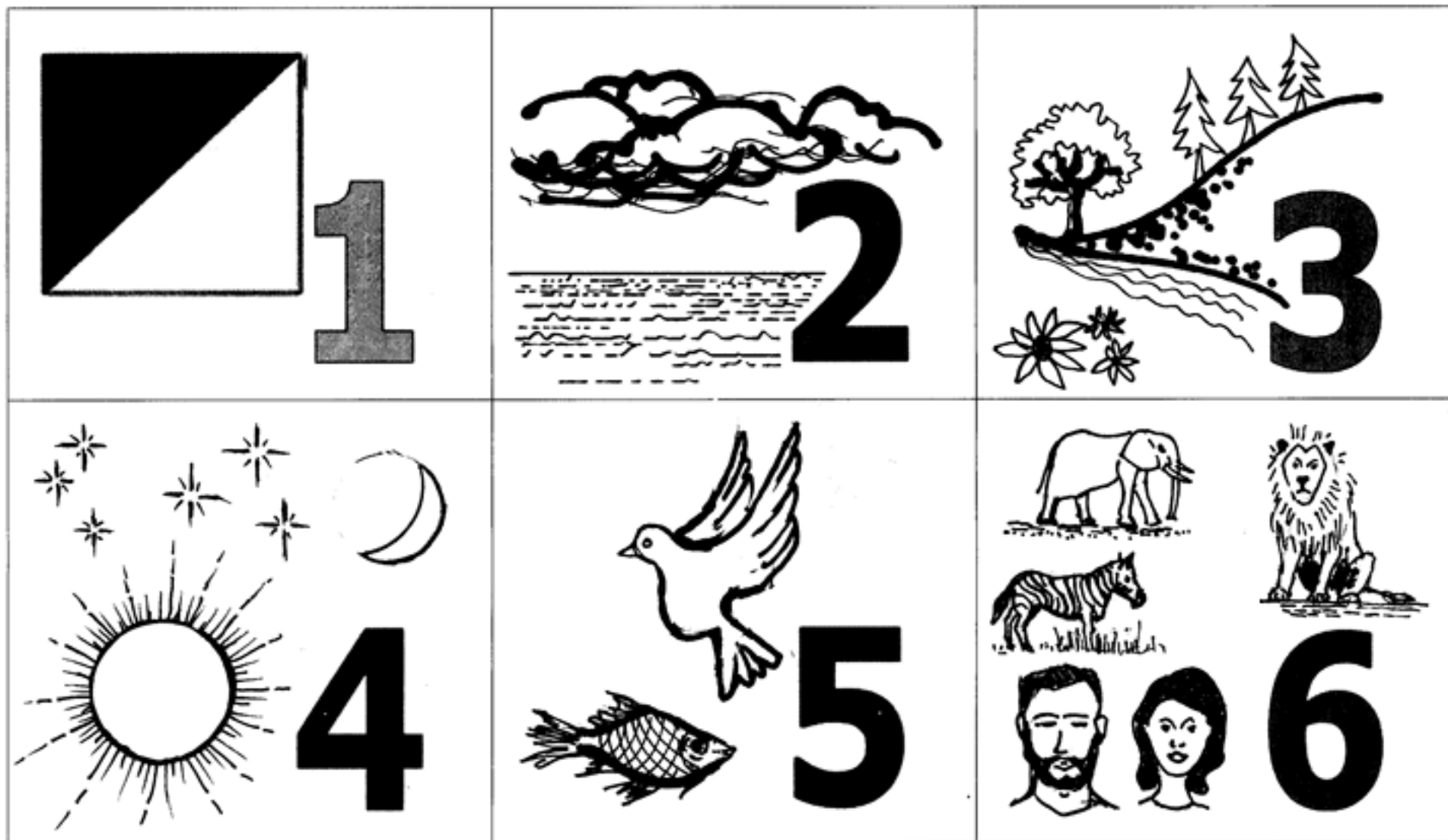
This was day three.

A rhyme to learn:

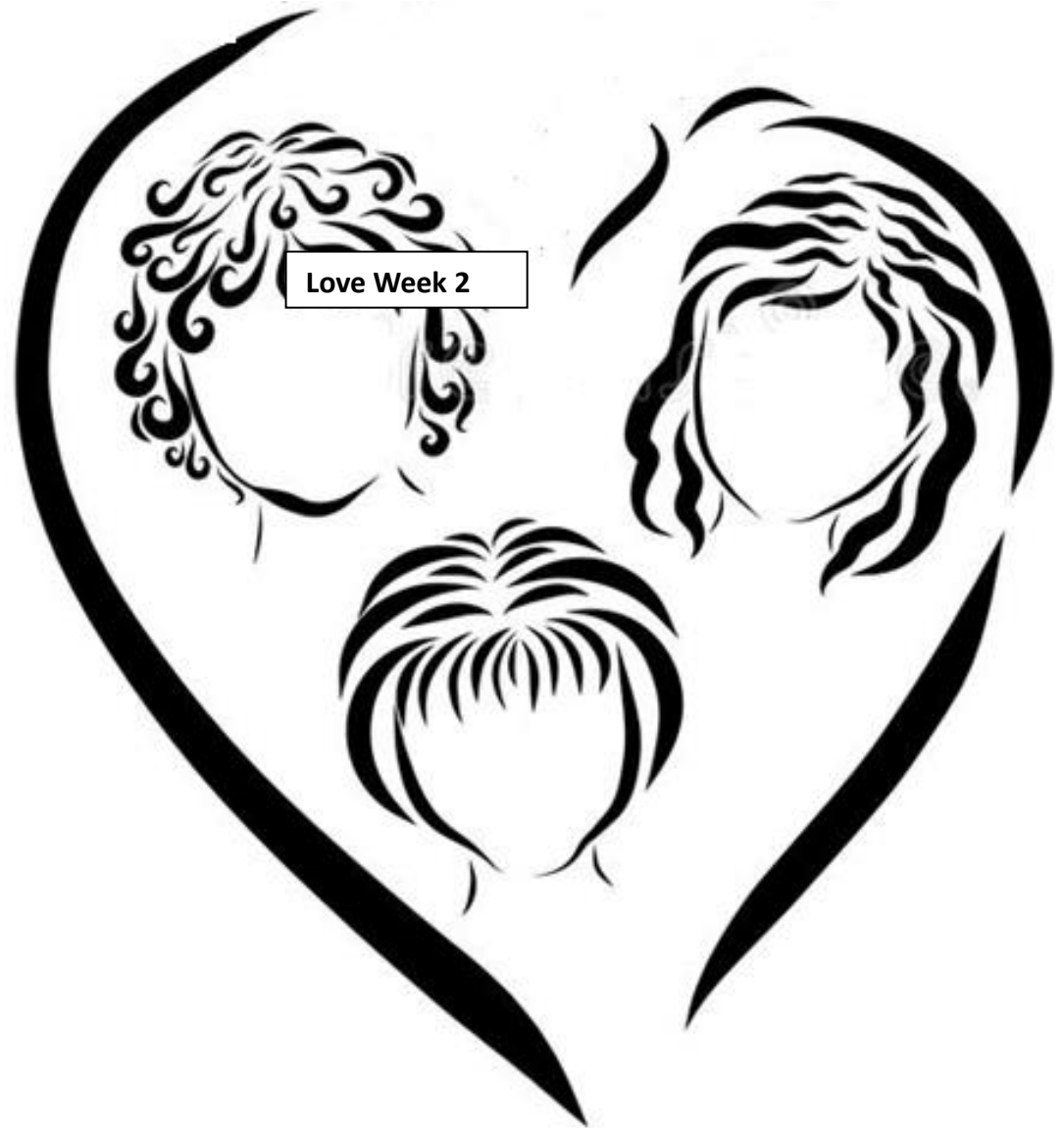

God put the sun in the sky, just in the right place. It is not too close to us. It is not too far away. It is just right. It is not too hot for us. It is not too cold for us.

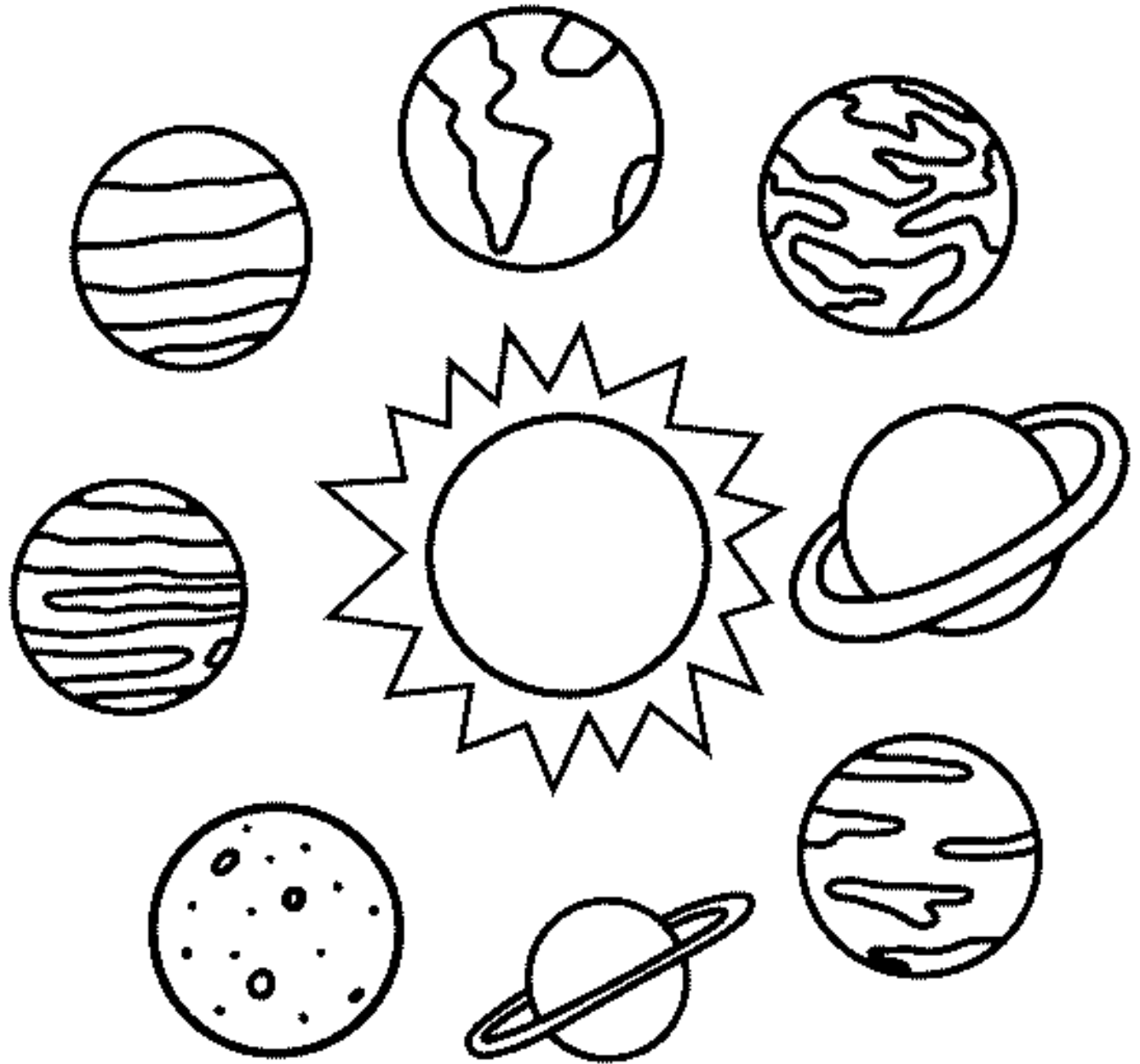
The sun is a star. God made all the stars. He knows exactly how many stars there are and He has names for them all. How many stars do you think there might be?

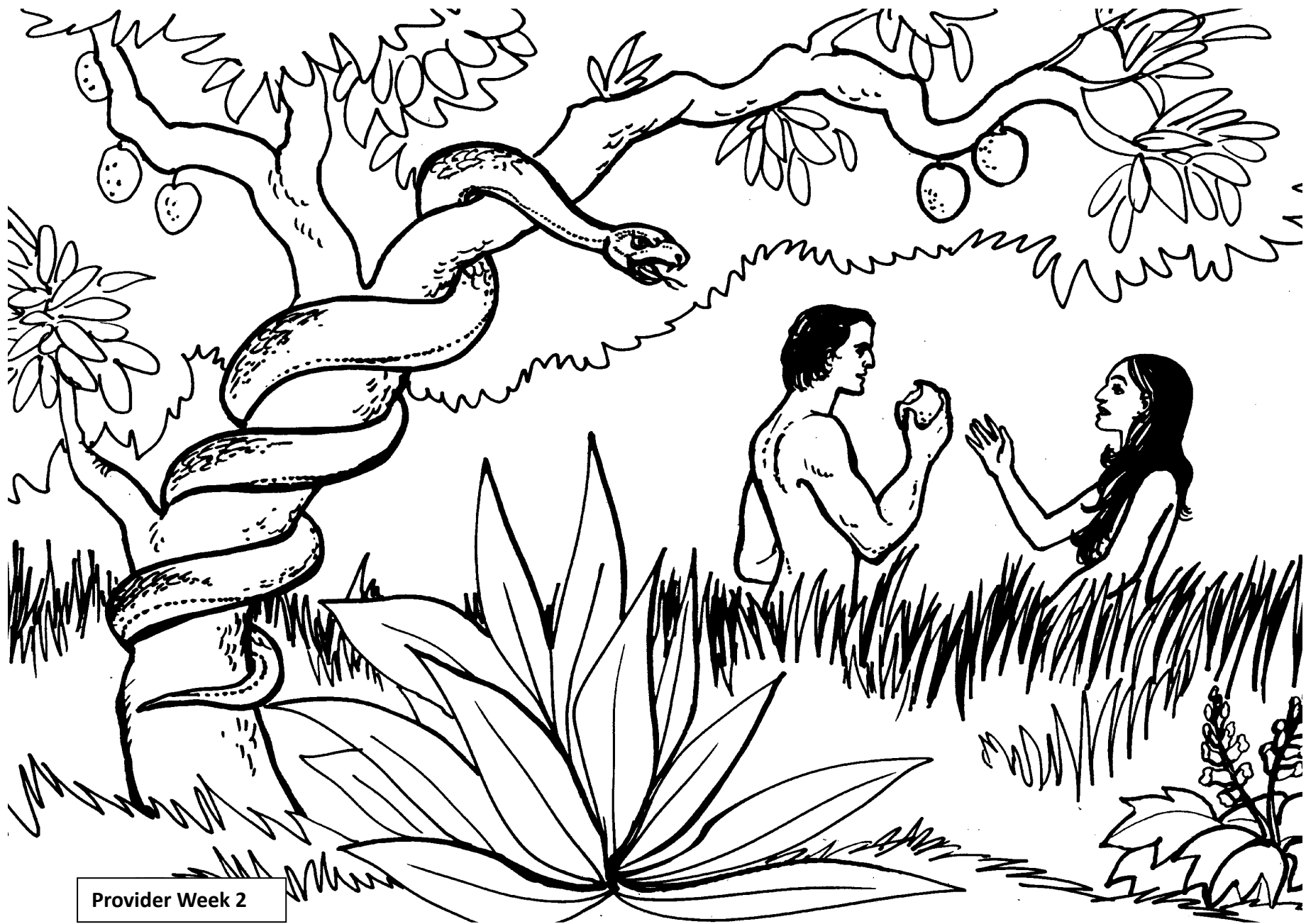
So Eve ate the fruit. She gave some to Adam. At once they knew that they had done something very wrong.

Jesus rode the donkey into the town of Jerusalem.

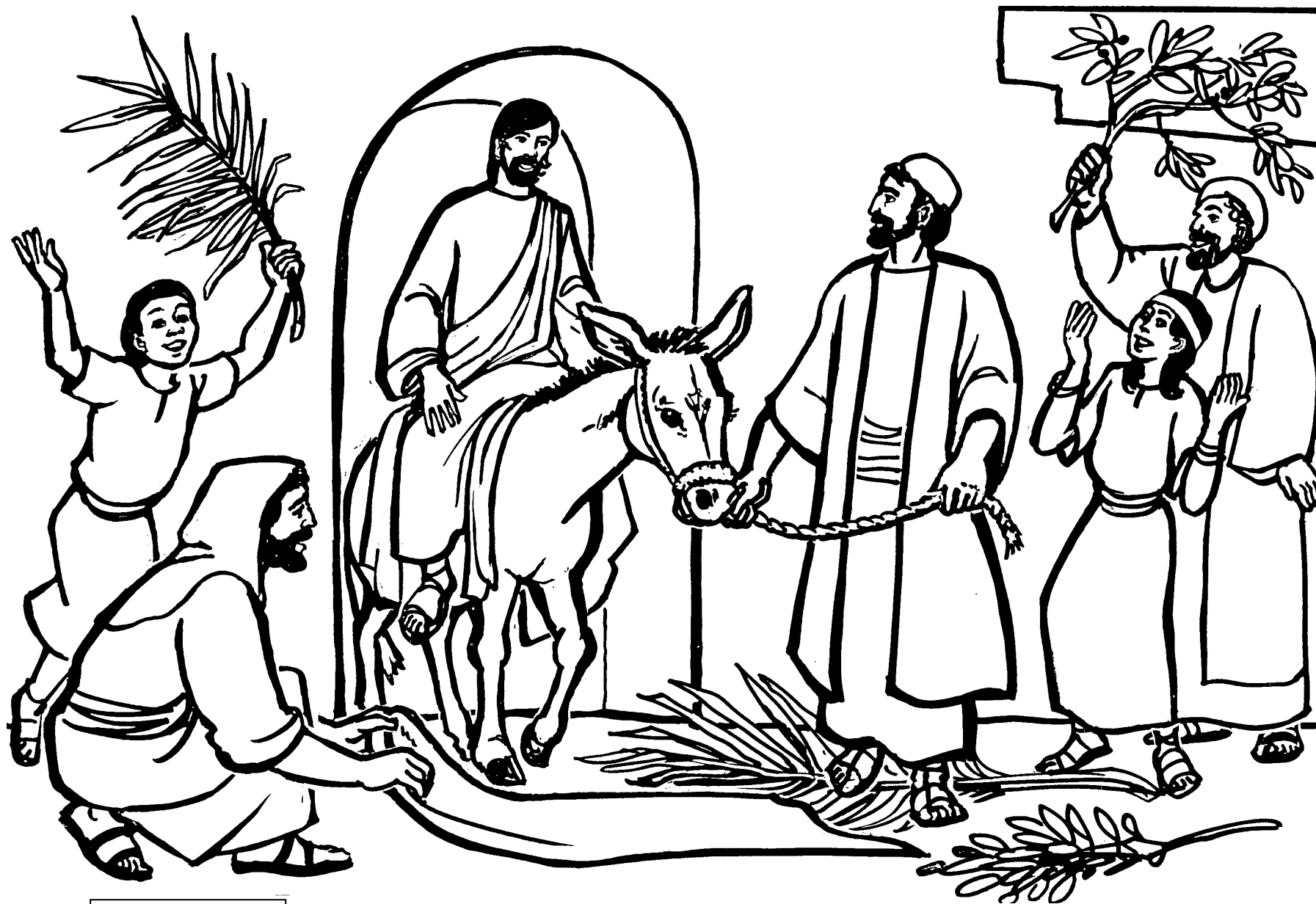
"Come and see Jesus," said the people in Jerusalem. "He is riding a donkey. He is the one who has done great miracles!"

God asked, "Will You touch the people and heal them and feed them?" Jesus said, "Yes I will."

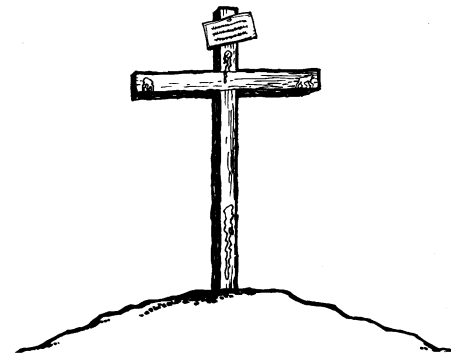
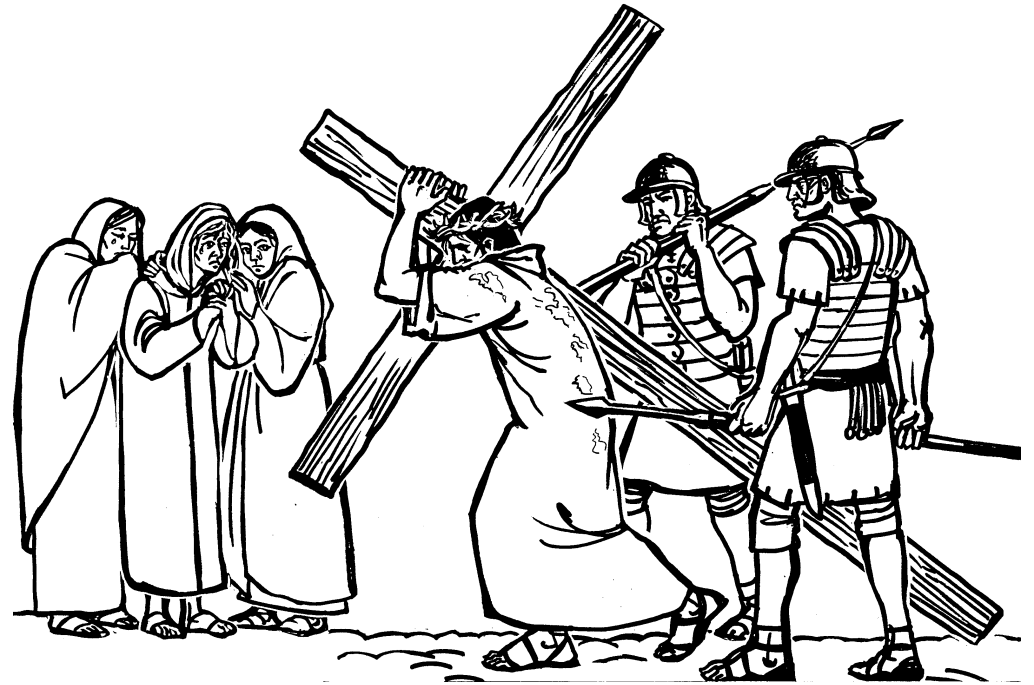
God asked, "Will You live on earth without ever making one wrong choice, without hurting people and hating people?" Jesus said, "Yes I will."

So, the Governor said he would have nothing to do with making the choice – whether to let Jesus go or let him die. He would leave it up to the other leaders.

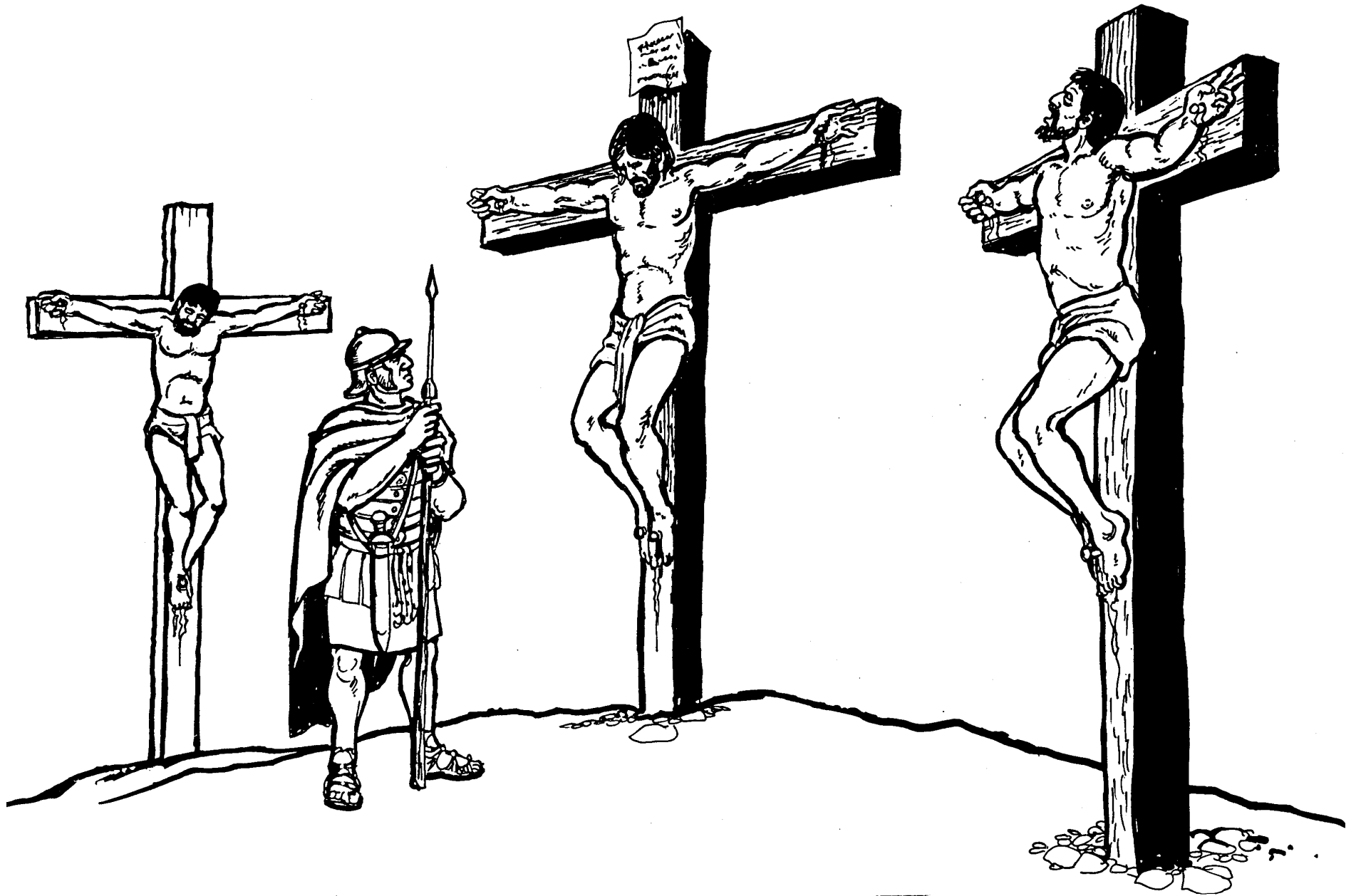
The soldiers led Jesus into their hall. They put a scarlet robe on him and made him a crown from a ring of thorns.

The leaders sent guards to watch the body to make sure no one took Jesus body.

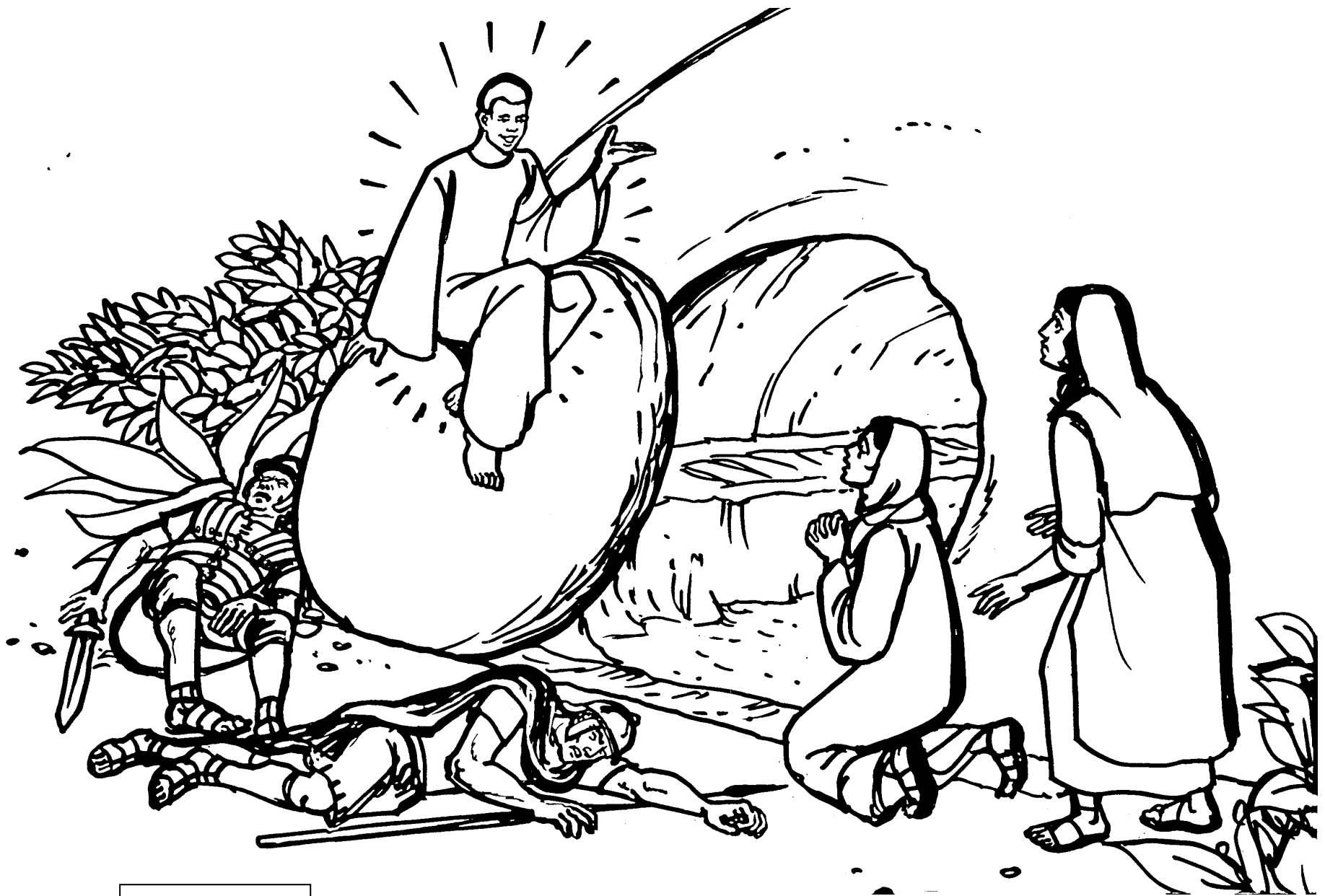
But early Sunday morning there was a big earthquake. An angel came from heaven and rolled the stone away.

A short time later, some of Jesus' disciples were fishing at night. They sailed out in their boat and threw their nets into the water. They waited and waited, but they did not catch anything.

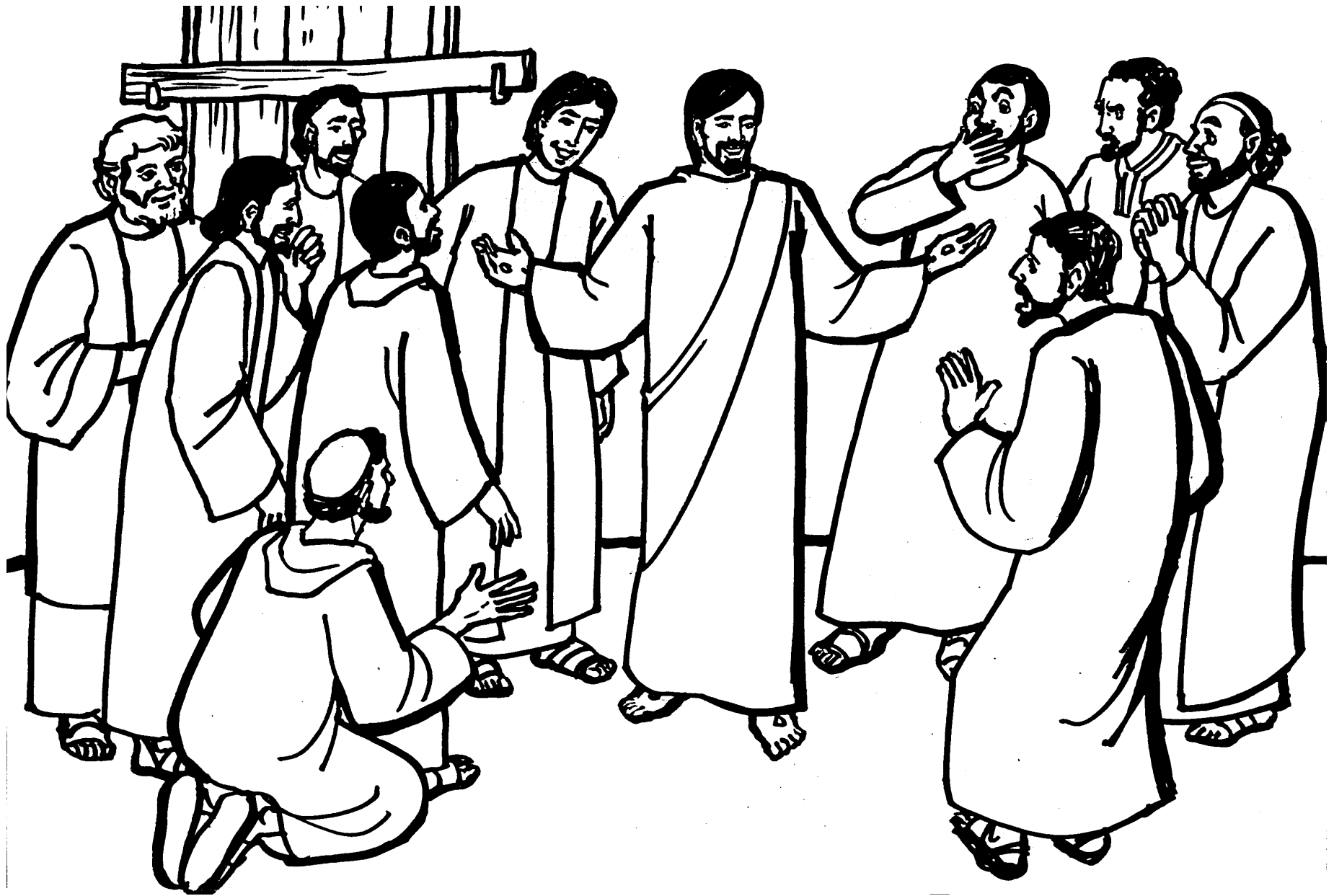
Early in the morning they saw someone standing on the shore. The man called, "Have you caught any fish?"

"No," they called back.

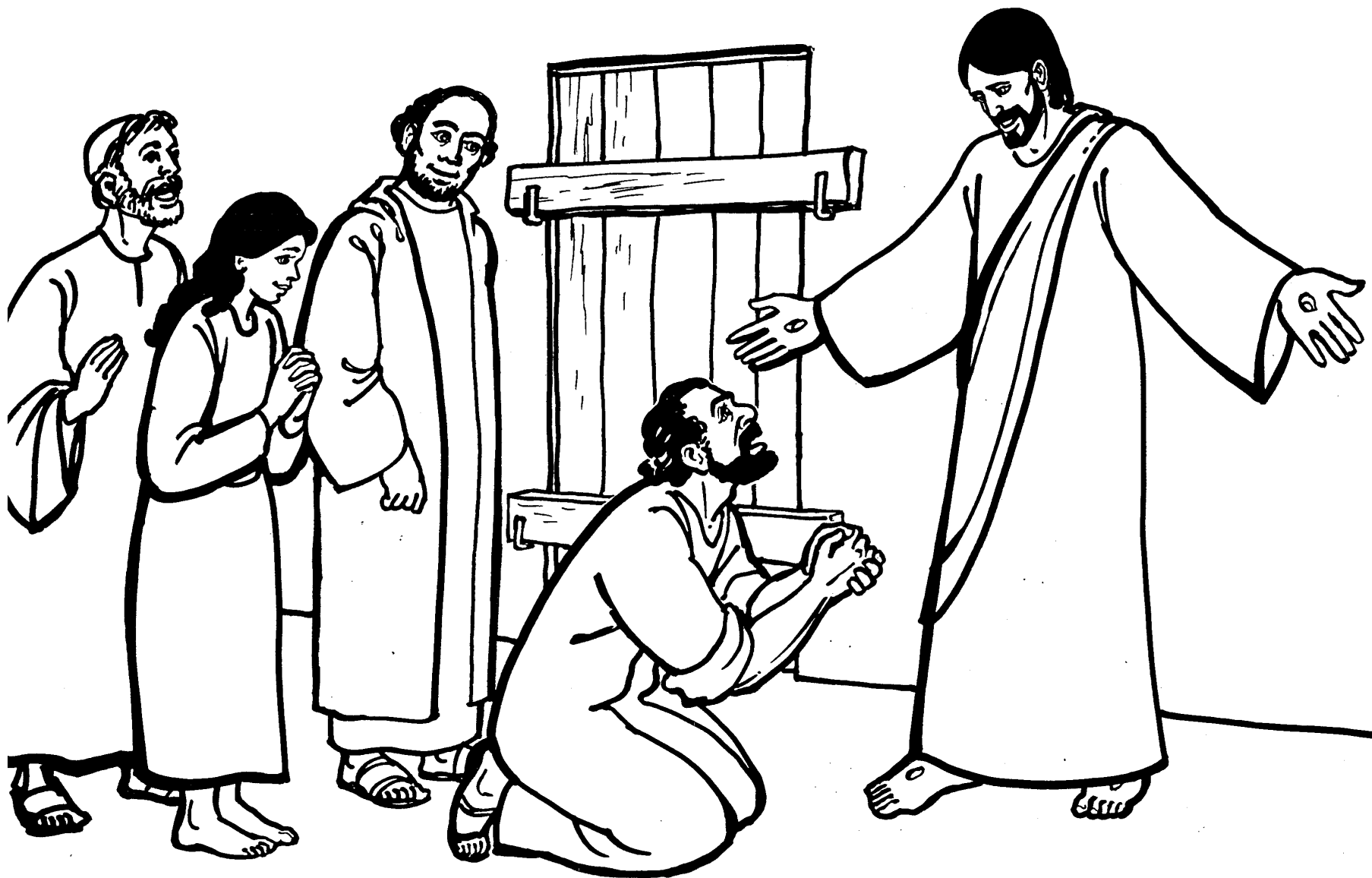
"Throw your net on the other side of the boat," said the man.

So they did, and their nets were soon full of fish. John looked at Peter and said, "It's Jesus!"

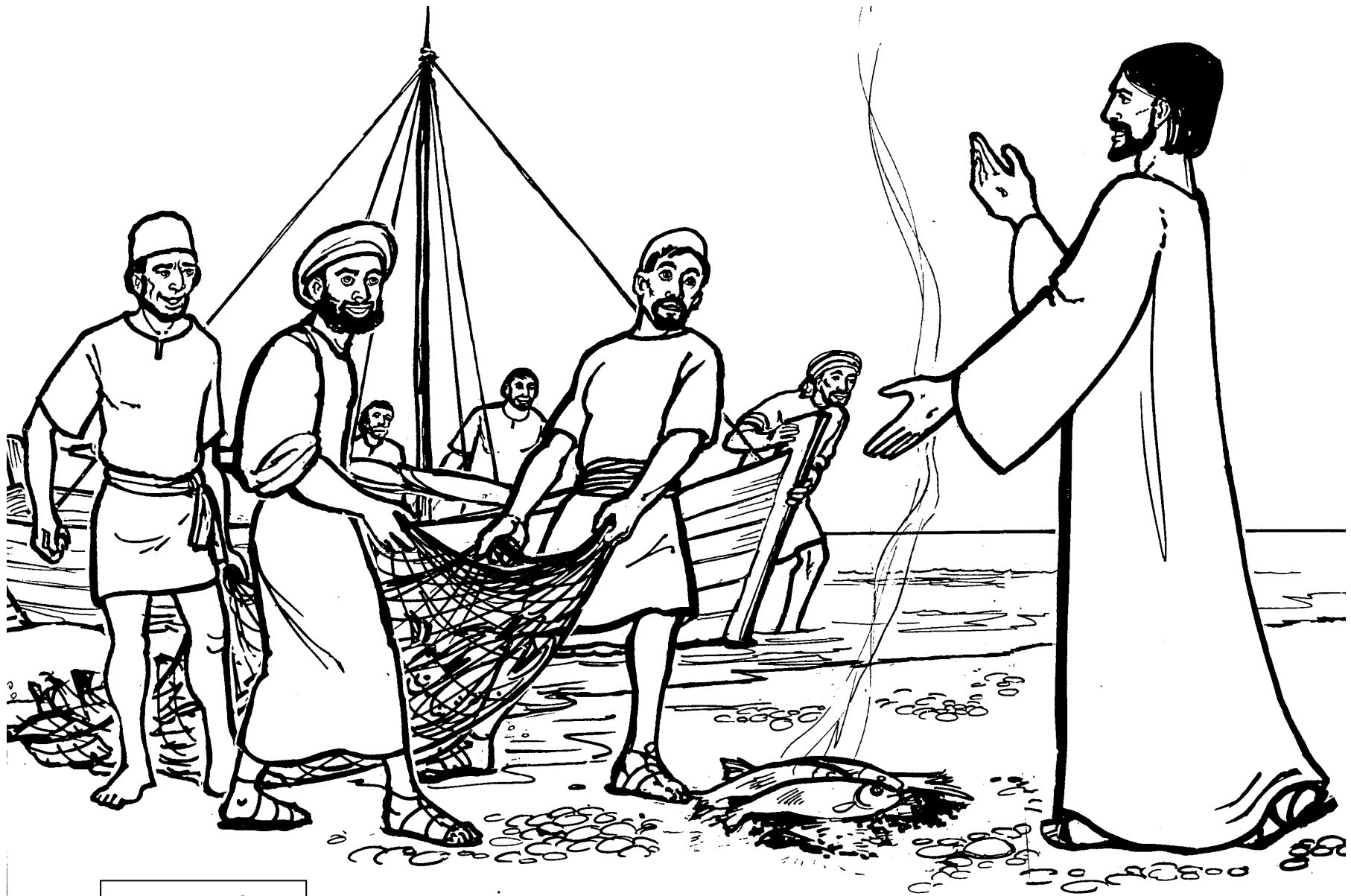

The disciples were so surprised. They stood looking up into the sky.

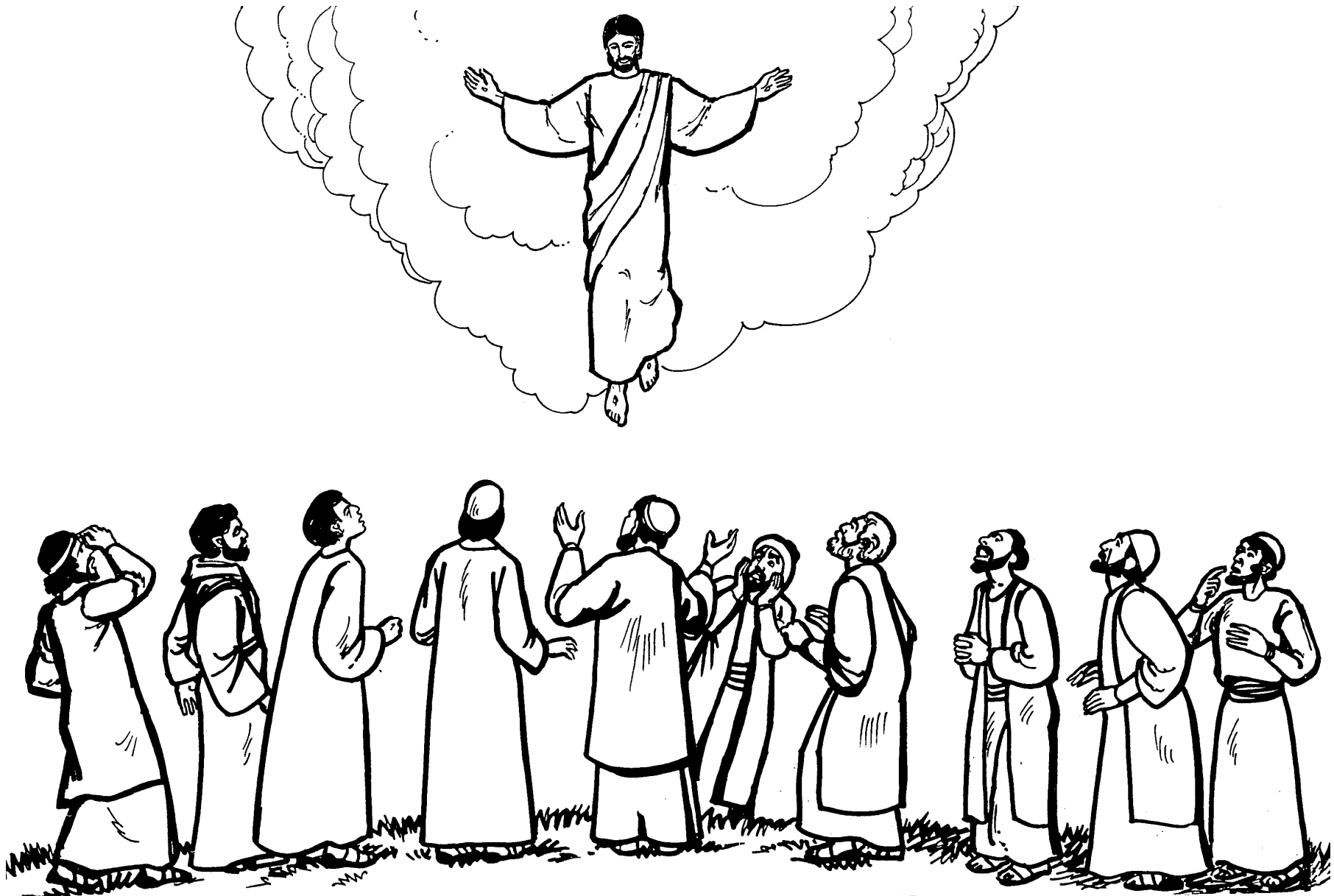
They had seen Jesus go up into heaven with their very own eyes!

When the light had gone, Saul couldn't see anything. He was blind!

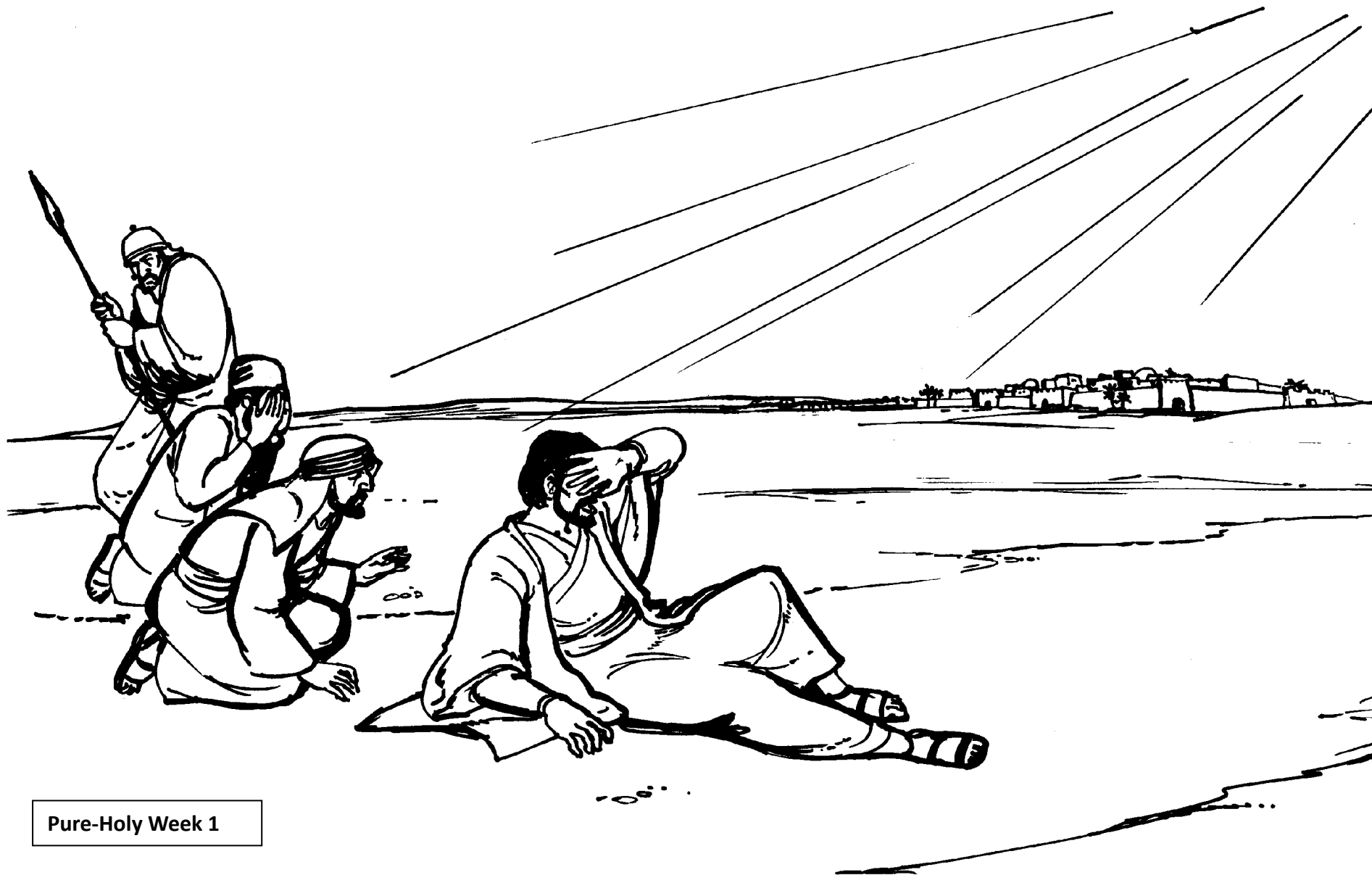
His friends who were with him didn't know what had happened. They took him by the hand and led him to the city of Damascus.

When Noah had finished, a father and mother of each animal went into Noah's Ark. Noah did not have to find them. They just came, because God sent them.

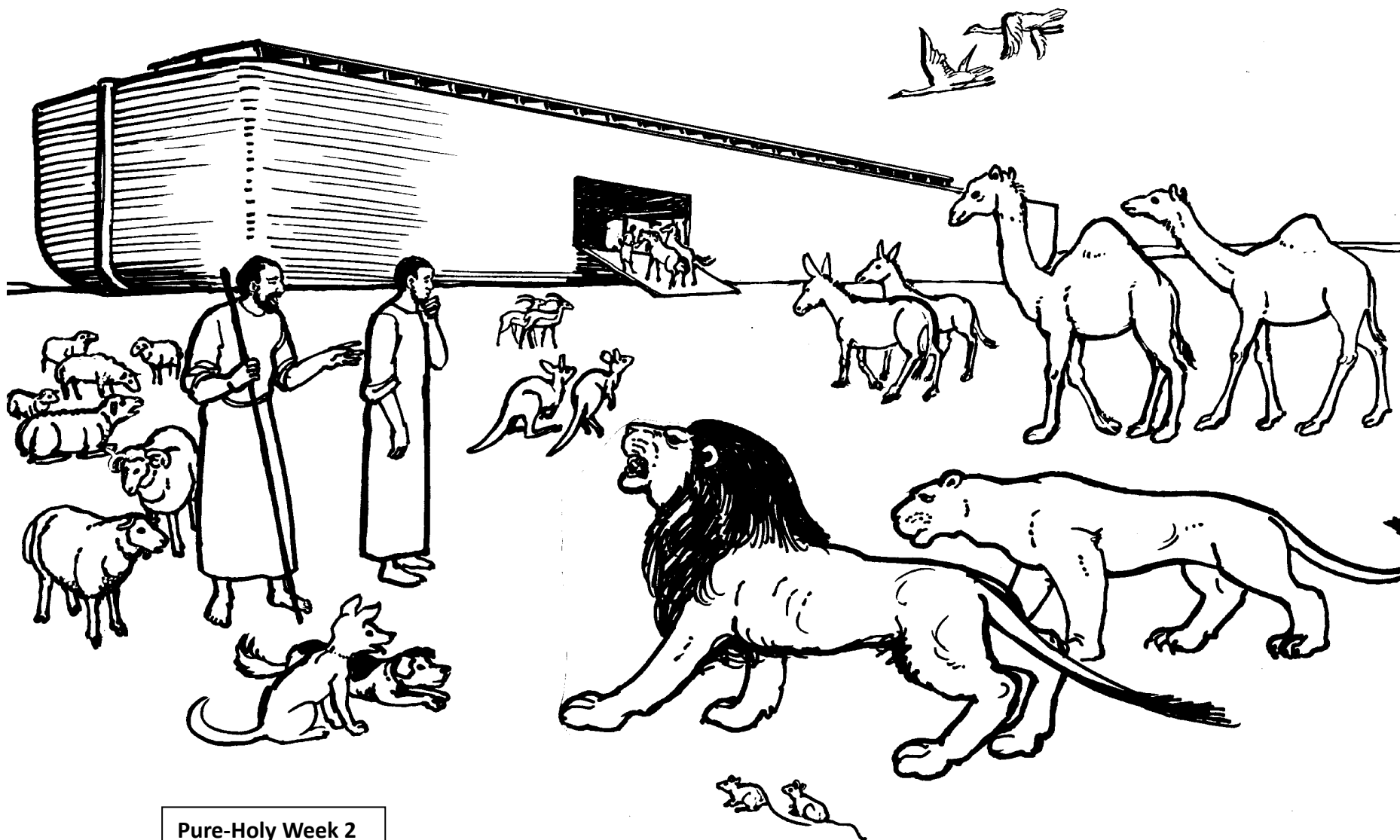
God shut the door and it began to rain. The water got deeper and deeper. But Noah, his family and the animals were safe and dry inside the Ark.

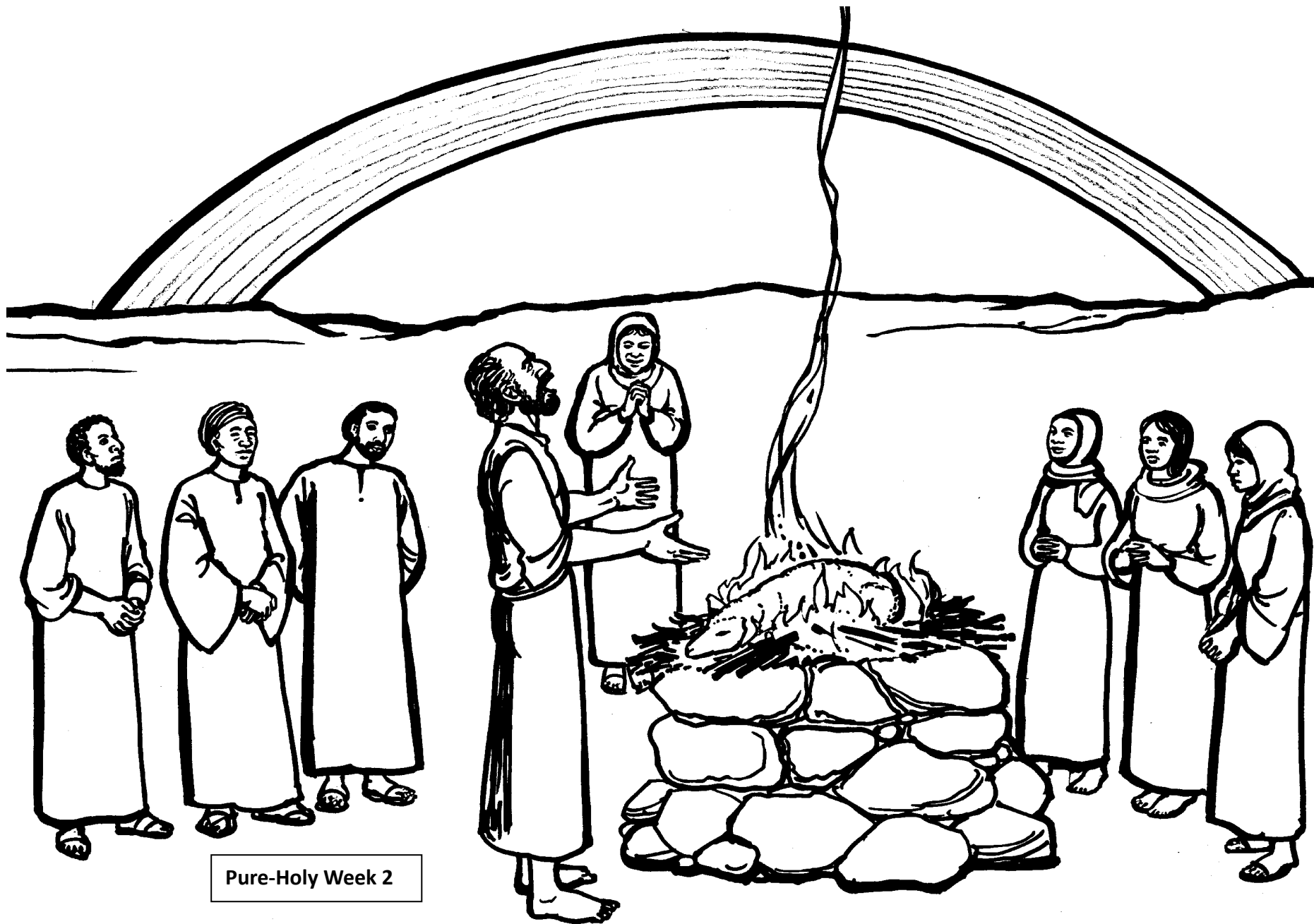

Jesus stopped under the tree. He looked up.

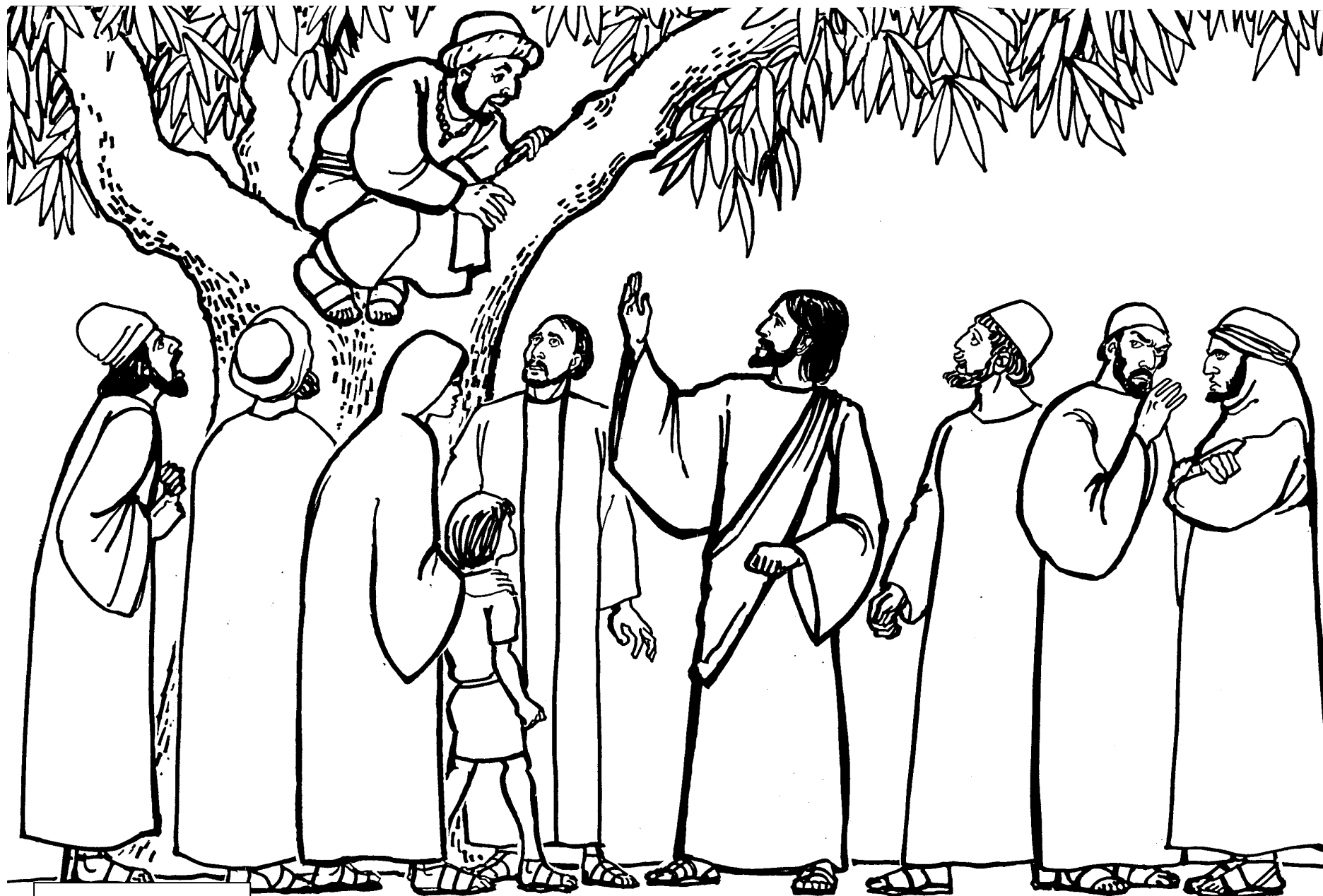
“Zacchaeus come down,” said Jesus, “I am coming to your house today.”

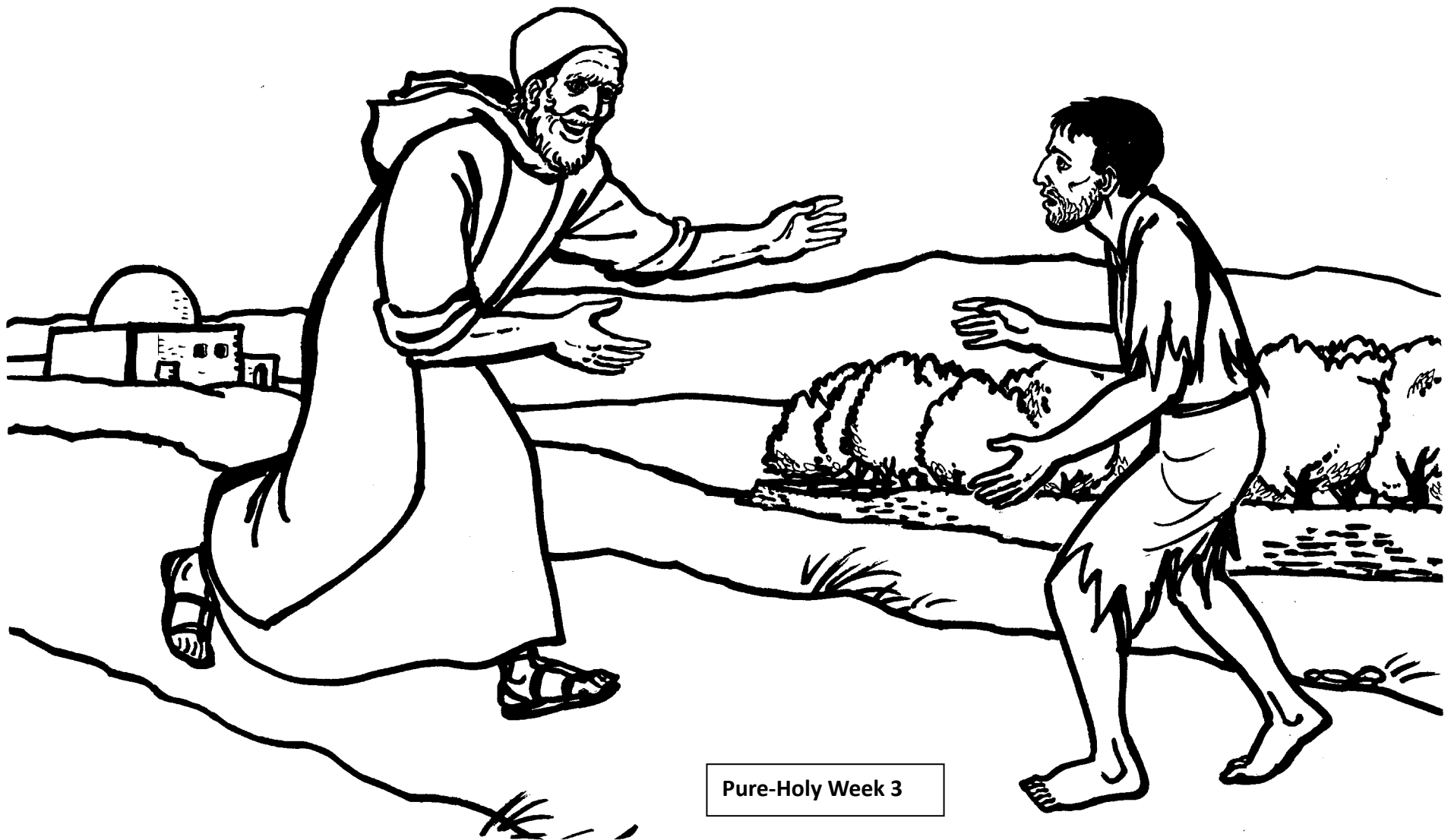
God wants us to forgive people who do wrong things to us, just like the father forgave his son. God wants us to forgive others just as he forgives us.

It was a long way to go. When he saw his brothers, he called out and waved. But his brothers were still angry.

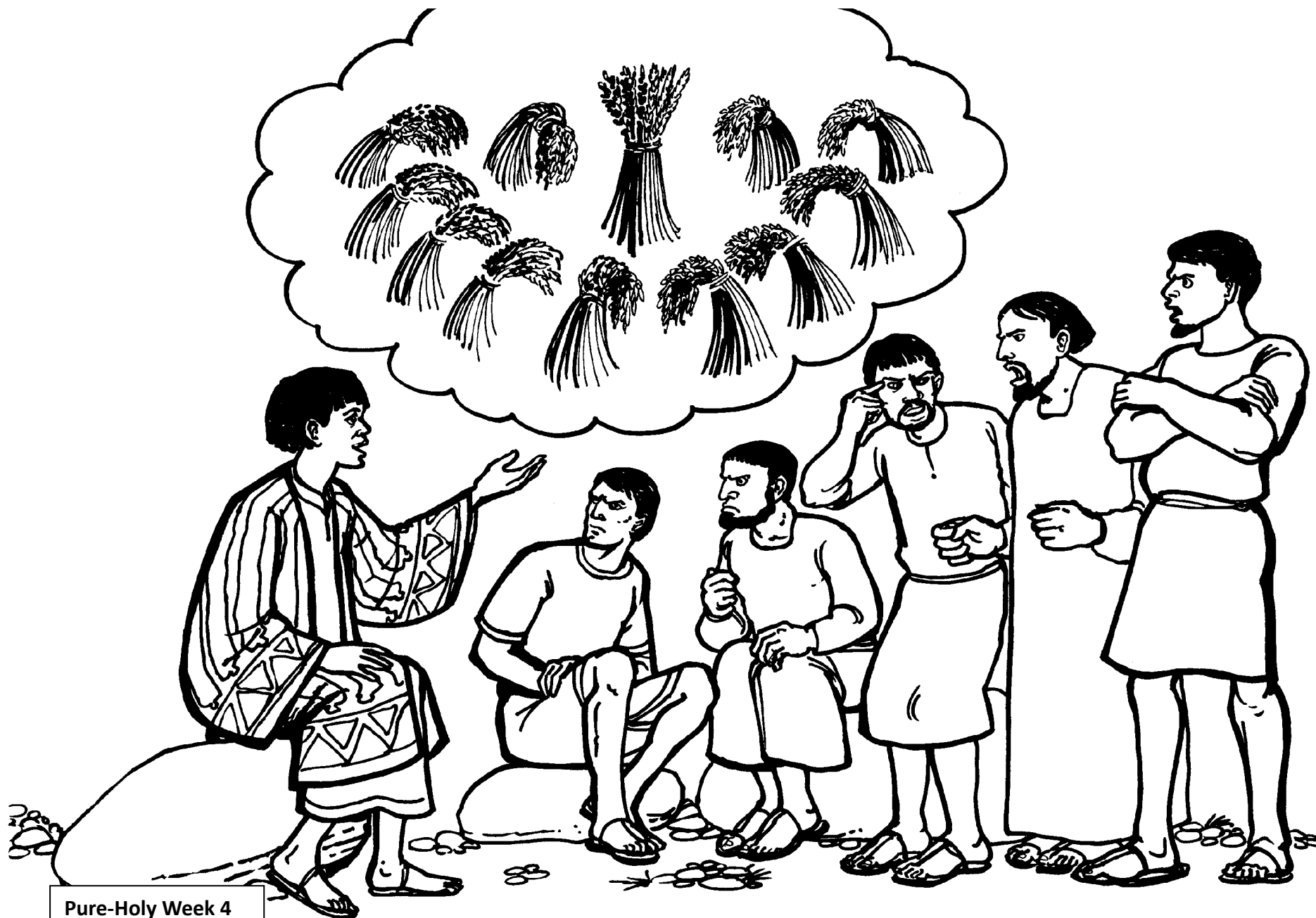
They were not kind and took his coat away. Then they put him down inside a big hole.

"Send for him at once," commanded Pharaoh.

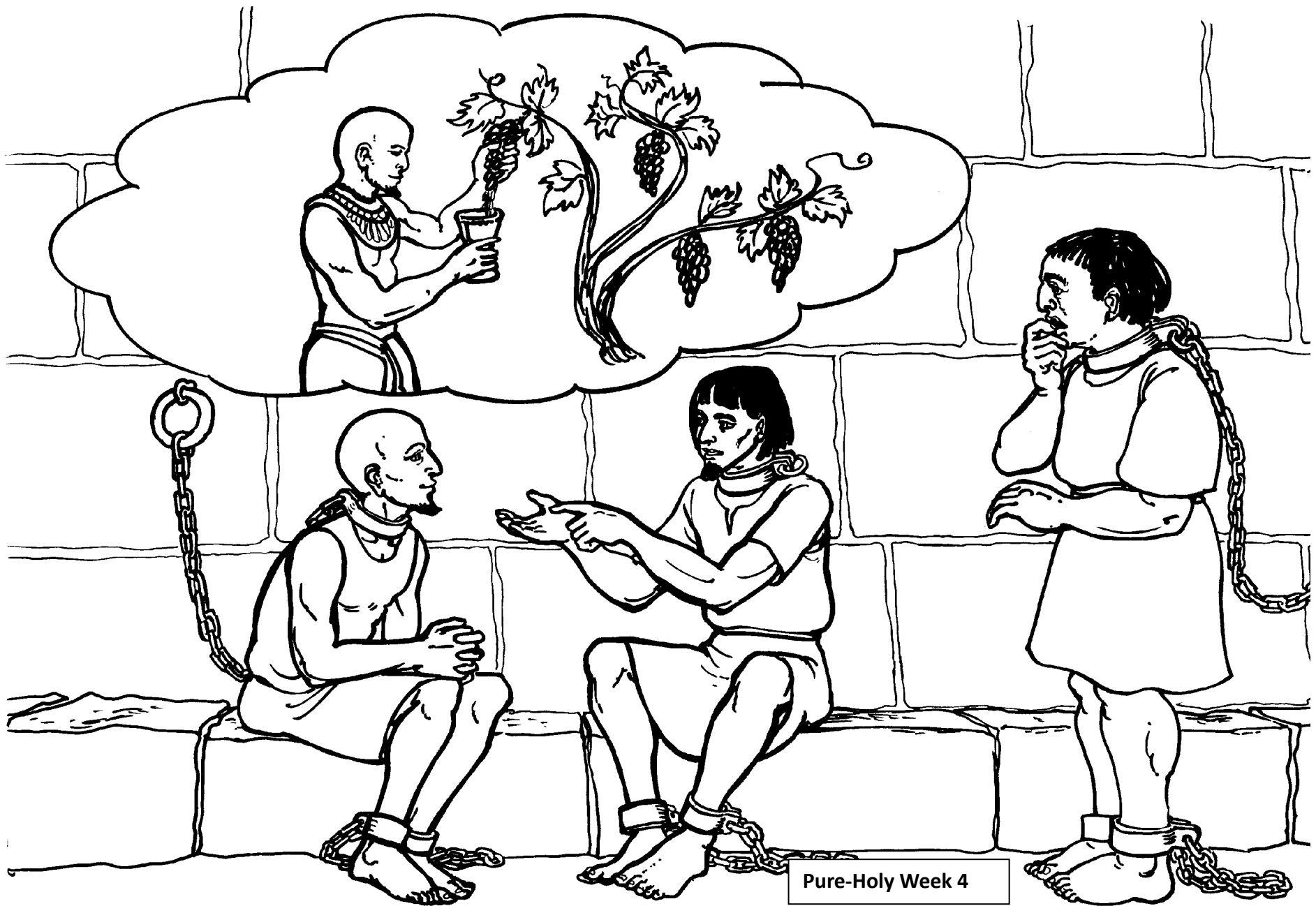
Pharaoh told Joseph about the dream.

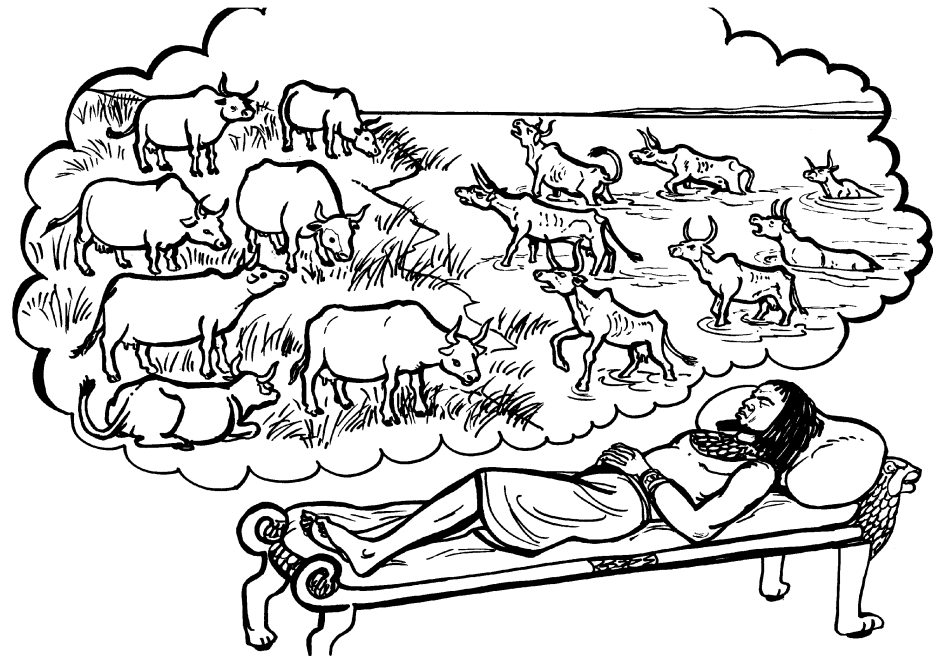

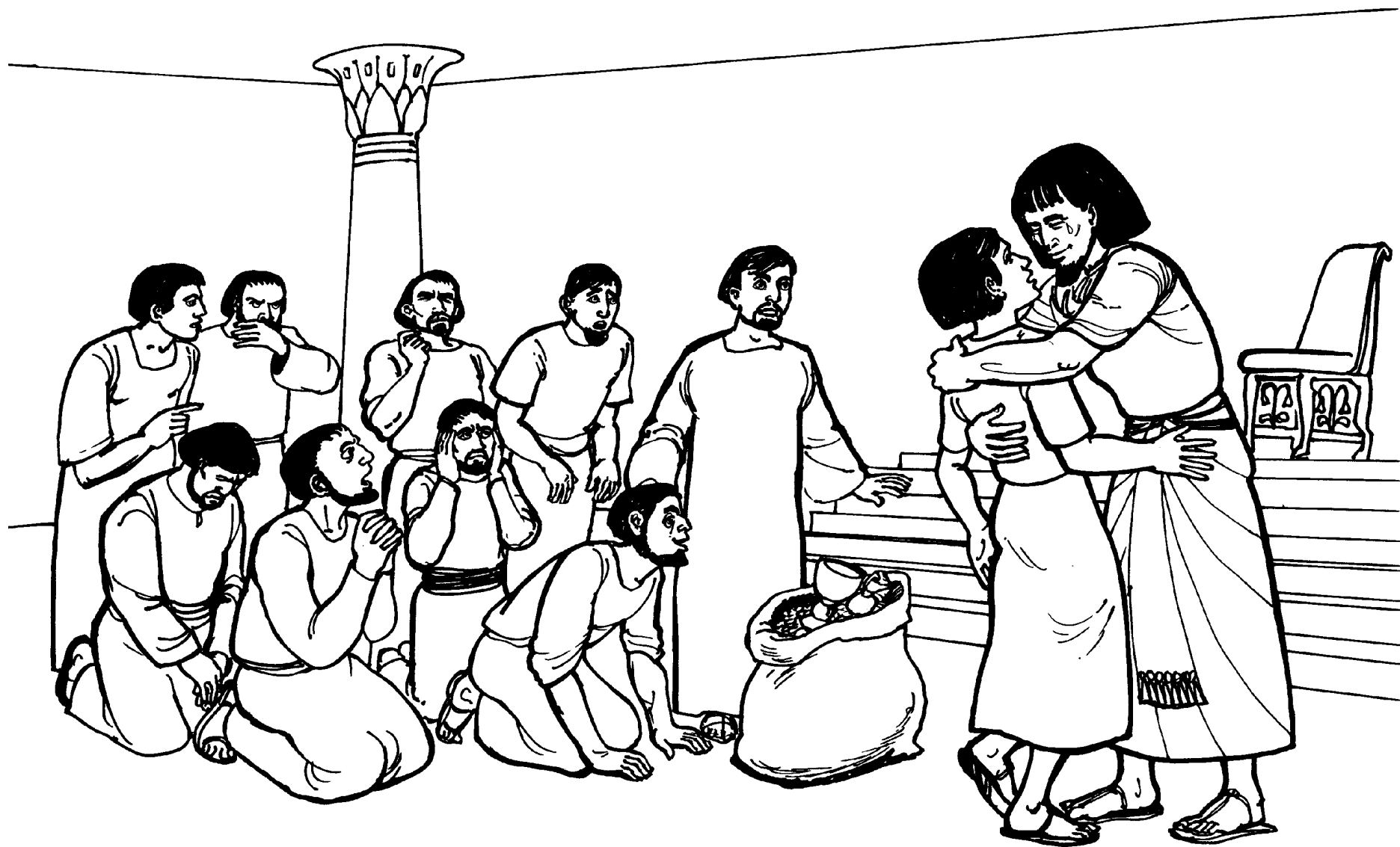
Joseph was put in charge of giving out the food. The brothers did not know this.

God said it was good.

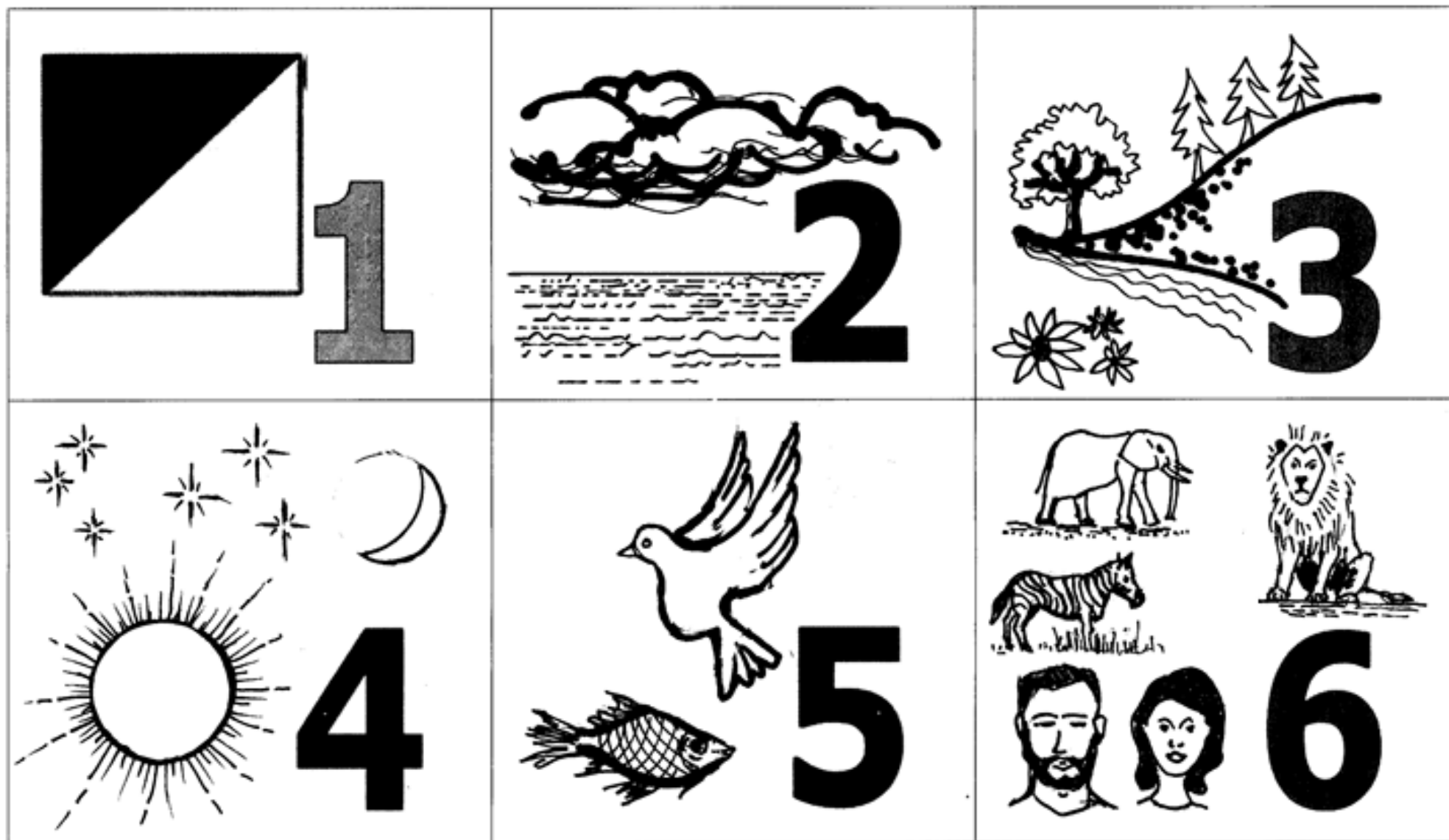
On Day 5 God made fish and birds.

Do you remember what He made on each day?

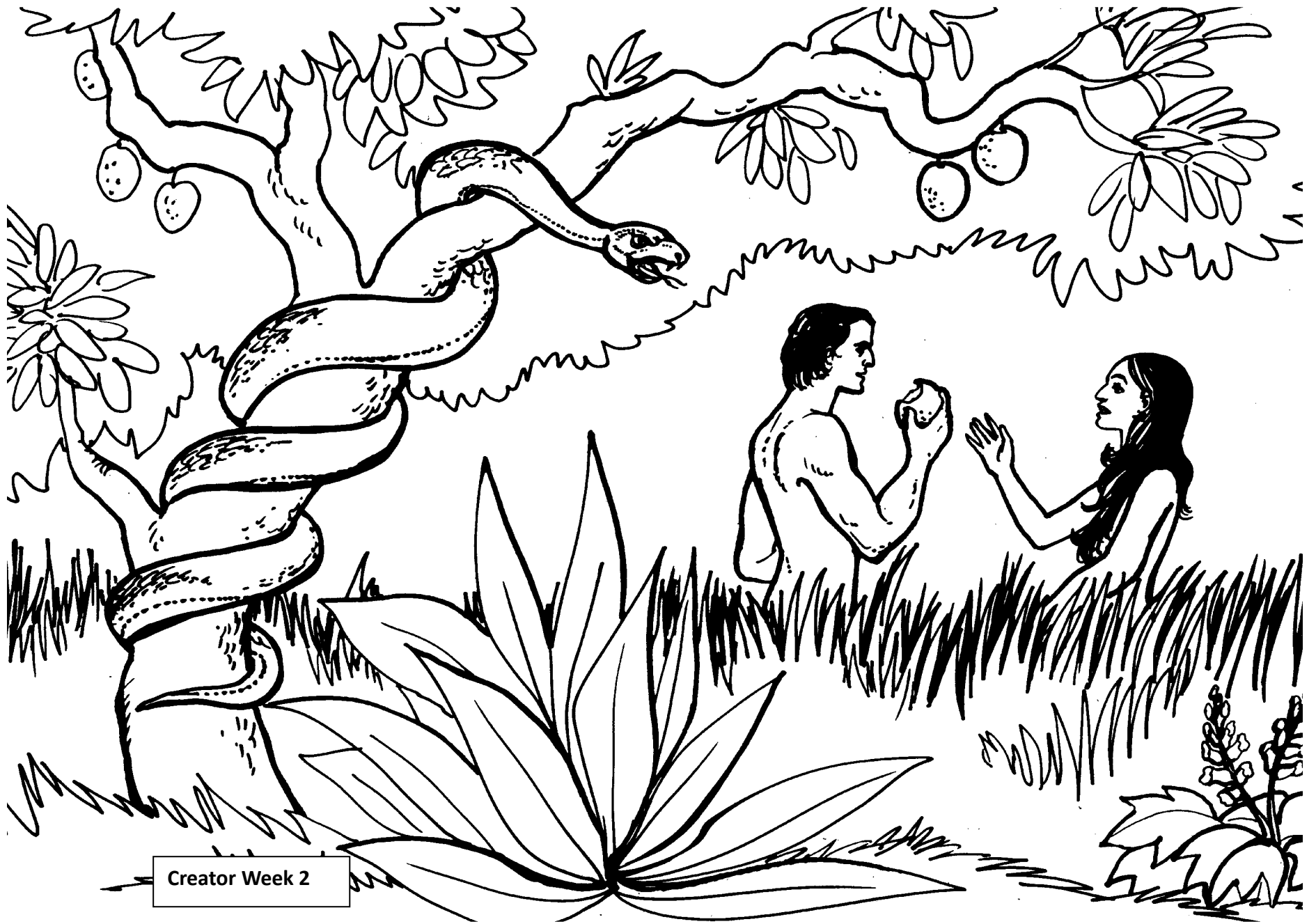
