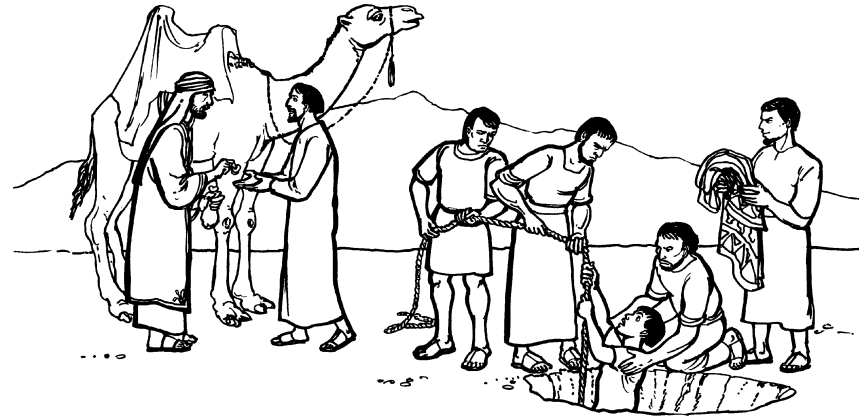

"God told me," said Joseph.

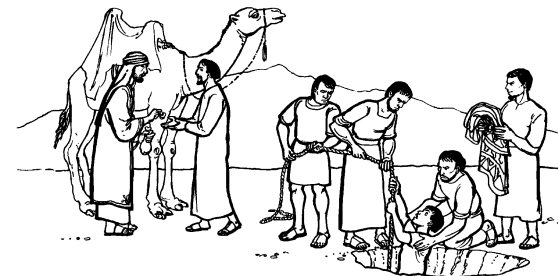
"You are very wise," said the Pharaoh.

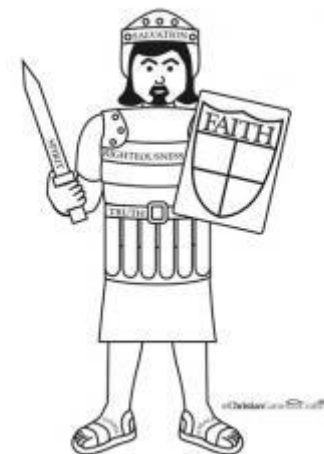

God wants us to be kind like King David. He wants us to care for people who

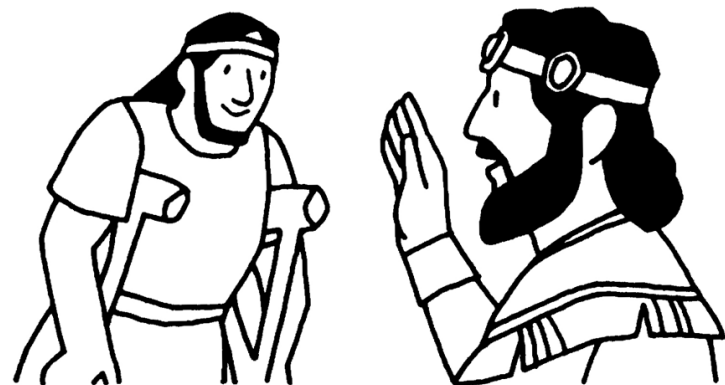
cannot do things as well as we can. God wants us to be kind and patient with people like this.










