


My heart is inside my chest. It is about the size of my fist. My heart is a pump. It pumps blood through my body.

<p>Some fibres are made from plastic. These are made into synthetic cloth like nylon.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">11</p>	<p>This is how clothes are made: First the fibres are made into thread.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">12</p>
<p>Second, the thread is made into cloth.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">13</p>	<p>Third, the cloth is cut into shapes and put together by sewing.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">14</p>
<p>Jesus said, "Look at the flowers. They do not make clothes for themselves. God gives them clothes." The petals are the clothes. God gives me clothes to wear too.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">15</p>	<p>When I grow out of my clothes Mum gives them to children smaller than myself.
