70. Lavatory Logic

I have a good friend who displays all her degrees and credentials in the toilet walls under the stairs of her home. This is an incongruous place for Oxford University documents. You won't be surprised to learn that she doesn't practice in Harley St in the prestigious medical heart of London, but chooses a rough housing estate for her medical ministry. A wall full of degrees and other framed certificates seem to speak of wisdom. But in reality, the signed and sealed paperwork speak more of intellectual ability and effort. They don't declare the important things of life, such as that the owner has a good marriage and loyal friends, that the individual is a person of integrity, fun and generously blesses others.

Qualifications, like a prestigious post/zip code and high income, can speak instead of pride. The owner might well meet with others feeling somewhat superior. And pride is the root sin of all the other deadly sins. A barely literate agricultural worker in a remote locality can access wisdom and the blessing it brings the Bible declares. A professor in a theological faculty, with access to innumerable library books and websites, can miss the fact that wisdom is inaccessible except through piety and the obedience which comes from living day by day within Kingdom precepts. This is very a very demanding task, we are unable to succeed without supernatural unction, and The Teacher, YHWH, promises this to us when we genuinely request it.

The Bible meta-narrative shows that God uses the unschooled and the highly educated, to advance the Kingdom. What is critical is their thirst for wisdom above knowledge and prestige.



"God alone knows the way to Wisdom,
