ACCURACY OF THE BIBLE (COMPARED TO OTHER ANCIENT MANUSCRIPTS)

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

1. What is "Manuscripts"?

It is the original handwritten text of an author's work.

2. What are some of the famous ancient manuscripts get passed down? Who are the authors?

Histories written by **Herodotus** (ca. 484 B.C.-ca. 425 B.C.) the first Greek writer who succeeded in writing a large-scale historical narrative. The narrative of the *Histories* tells the rise and fall of the Persian empire.

The Illiad written by **Homer** (ca. 800 B.C. – 700 B.C.) a Greek Poet. *The Iliad*" is usually considered to be the earliest work in the whole Western literary tradition, and one of the best known stories about war, peace and love of all time.

The Holy Bible The bible is a collection of 66 books, written by 40 different authors, over 1500 years, in 3 different languages, on 3 different continents.

Old Testament – 39 books

First five books (The Torah) were believed to be written by Mosses (1400 BC)

Last book (Malachi) was written by the prophet Malachi (430BC)

New Testament – 27 books

First book – Gospel of Matthew written by Disciple Matthew (during the first century)

Last Book –Revelation written by Apostle John (90 AD)

All these books share a **common storyline**, the **creation**, **fall**, and **redemption** of God's people.

Question 1a {**B.C** – Before Christ; **A.D.**— Anno Domini, which is Latin for "year of our Lord," and it means the number of years since the birth of Jesus Christ; **ca.** Latin word which means "around".}

Mark the event mentioned above on time line below. Notice the centre should be 1AD not 0AD

Question 1b (2%)

Imagine going to any library in the world. Find 66 books, written by 40 different authors, over 1500 years, in 3 different languages, written on 3 different continents. However, they must share a common storyline, a common theme, and a common message, with no historical errors or contradictions.

Comment on this challenge. Describe the probability with words like (Certainly, highly likely....certainly not).

Hence, comment on the likelihood (chance/ probability) of the formation of the Bible if done merely by human effort. Give reference to the background information from previous page. Also notice that that "All scripture *is* given by inspiration of God, and *is* profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness. (2 Timothy 3:16)"

ACTIVITY

Step 1: Get into groups of 2, call 1 person X and the other person Y

Step 2: Get all the X students to sit outside the room for a few minutes

Step 3: The teacher will then write a sentence e.g. Fred got up, walked to the door, and then opened it.

Step 4: The Y students will then write out that sentence, but deliberately change 1 word completely.

Step 5: Each Y student write their changed sentence on the board.

Step 6: The X students will then come back into the room. They need to figure out the original sentence.


For those who want to know more...

A lot of people still think that the New Testament was written in the 2nd and 3rd century AD (i.e. about 100 years after the eye witnesses died off). However, the Gospels of Matthew, Mark and Luke were all quoted by Ignatius bishop of Antioch (died 107AD) in the first century, and just recently there was another very important finding which reports on a fragment of the Gospel of Mark that is most likely dated before 90AD. For one of the books to be accepted into the New Testament, a number of tests were applied. The books had to be written by an eye witness or someone who knew the eyewitness's. The documents had to be written early and the writings had to fit into accepted teaching all around the Mediterranean.

So 550 BC means 550 years before Jesus was born

And 2000 AD **almost** means 2000 years after Jesus was born ...

... except AD started at 1, not 0



So, 2 AD is actually 1 Year after Jesus was born And 2000 AD is actually 1999 Years after Jesus was born.
