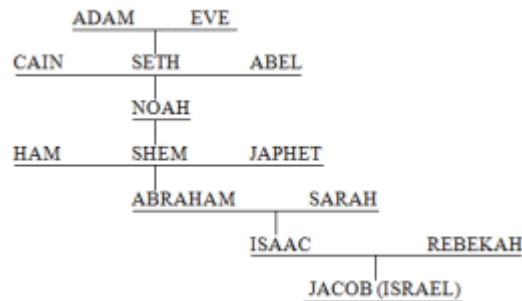

This is a simplified family tree of people in Bible history. There are extra generations not shown. These can be found in Genesis 5:1-32 and Genesis 11:10-27.

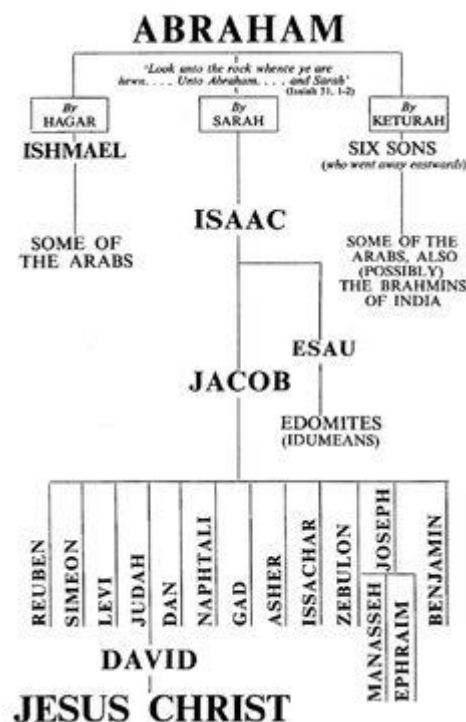
